REPORTING ABUSE: AN UPDATE

Since 2002, the Archdiocese of Newark has formalized a process of reporting sexual abuse allegations, in accordance with the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, Essential Norms and a Memorandum of Understanding between the state prosecutors' offices and the NJ Dioceses. A year ago, Pope Francis issued an apostolic letter, *Vos estis lux mundi* ("You are the light of the world") that strengthened and formalized the process for holding bishops accountable. As part of the implementation of the letter here in the United States, a platform was created by an independent, third party providing a secure, confidential, and professional way to report allegations against living bishops. This service is in place to gather and relay reports of sexual misconduct involving bishops of the United States, and reports of their intentional interference in a sexual abuse investigation. Individuals may make a report online at www.ReportBishopAbuse.org or by calling toll free (800) 276-1562. If you wish to report any other kind of misconduct by a bishop — or sexual abuse by a priest, deacon, religious brother or sister, or layperson working for the Church — please contact the Archdiocese of Newark at (201) 407-3256.

A Message from Our Pastor



Dear Friends,

As I am writing on this Monday morning, I'm delighted with our first weekend of reopened Church. We had a legion of volunteers who kept us safe, protected, and focused on the sacrament. And for them, so many of them, I'm so grateful.

Although we counted the number of folks entering the Church, I haven't seen the written number for each Mass, but since I was present at each one I can summarize. Our Saturday evening Mass at 5:00 p.m. had about 26. On Sunday morning: 8:00 a.m. had about 10, 10:00 a.m. had just under 50, 11:30 a.m. had about 26, and 1:00 p.m. had just under 50. While the obligation to attend Mass is still dispensed for the foreseeable future, we are doing everything possible to make sure our Church environment is safe, healthy, and available to all. I suspect that next week we may receive more people. This may cause a problem for the 10:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. Masses, since the maximum number of people for worship as per the latest information from the Cardinal's office is 50. Sadly, our volunteers will have to politely cap the number at 50. If you're number 51 or above, please wait in the car and have the volunteers contact one of the priests to bring Holy Communion out to you in the car.

We continue to have two cleanings of our Church. The group is asking that each parishioner come to Church with their own Clorox or sanitizing wipes to clean only the area where they were sitting, kneeling, etc. After each Mass, one of our staff members or volunteers will do a second cleaning with hospital-grade sanitizer.

We continue our work of cleaning out the closets of the Redmond Center. I've relocated the nicer plates, wine glasses, white table linens to the rectory basement, since they aren't used that frequently. The very large closet in between the men's and ladies' restrooms is not cleaned out and repaired. Sadly, we discovered some moisture damage to that back wall. We are hoping that the extra table and chairs will be more easily accessible and ready to obtain.

We've discovered a large number of plastic flowers. The layer of dust on them says that they've been there untouched for MANY years. To date no one has claimed them. They're yours for the taking. Just let me know.

We continue to fall short of our 1,000 subscribers to our parish YouTube page to livestream from there. We are hoping to move the livestream from Father Danny's personal page to our new parish YouTube page. AND . . . thanks so much for your comments on our messages. Keep them coming. Since these daily videos were created to replace our daily Masses and our preaching, we may move on from a daily message. Father Danny and I will be meeting to discuss it. Sadly, the number of views of these videos hasn't been overwhelming so it's time to reevaluate them.

Let's keep praying for each other.

Mensaje de Nuestro Pastor



Queridos amigos,

Estoy escribiendo esto el lunes por la mañana, estoy encantado con nuestro primer fin de semana de reapertura de la iglesia. Teníamos una legión de voluntarios que nos mantenían seguros, protegidos y enfocados en el sacramento. Y con ellos, tantos de ellos, estoy muy agradecido.

Aunque contamos el número de personas que ingresaron a la iglesia, no he visto aun el número por escrito de cada misa, pero como estuve presente en cada una puedo resumir. Nuestra misa del sábado por la tarde a las 5:00 tenía alrededor de 26. El domingo por la mañana; 8:00 tenía alrededor de 10, 10:00 tenía poco menos de 50, 11:30 tenía alrededor de 26, 1:00 tenía poco menos de 50. Si bien la obligación de asistir a misa todavía se dispensa en un futuro previsible, estamos haciendo todo lo posible para asegurarnos que el ambiente de nuestra iglesia sea seguro, saludable y está disponible para todos. Creo que la próxima semana podemos recibir más personas. Esto puede causar un problema para las misas de 10:00 y 1:00, ya que el número máximo de personas según la última información de la oficina del Cardenal es 50. Lamentablemente, nuestros voluntarios tendrán que limitar cortésmente el número a 50. Si eres el número 51 o superior, espera en el auto y haz que los voluntarios se comuniquen con uno de los sacerdotes para llevarte la comunión en el auto. Continuamos teniendo dos limpiezas de nuestra iglesia. El grupo está pidiendo que cada feligrés venga a la iglesia con su propio Clorox o toallitas desinfectantes para limpiar solo el área donde estaban sentados, arrodillados, etc. Después de cada misa, uno de los miembros de nuestro personal y otros voluntarios harán una segunda limpieza con desinfectante de grado hospitalario.

Continuamos nuestro trabajo y limpieza de los armarios del Redmond Center. He reubicado los mejores platos, copas de vino y manteles blancos en el sótano de la rectoría, ya que no se usan con tanta frecuencia. El armario muy grande entre los baños de hombres y mujeres no se limpia ni repara. Lamentablemente, descubrimos algunos daños por humedad en la pared posterior. Esperamos que ahora se mas fácil acceder y alcanzar las sillas y las mesas adicionales.

Hemos descubierto una gran cantidad de flores de plástico. La capa de polvo en ellas dice que han estado allí sin tocarlas durante MUCHOS años. Hasta la fecha nadie las ha reclamado. Si las quieres pueden ser tuyas. Sólo házmelo saber.

Continuamos por debajo de nuestros 1000 suscriptores a nuestra página parroquial de YouTube para transmitir en vivo desde allí. Esperamos mover la transmisión en vivo de la página personal del P. Danny a nuestra página parroquial. Y muchas gracias por sus comentarios sobre nuestros mensajes. Sigán comentando. Dado que estos videos diarios fueron creados para reemplazar nuestras misas diarias y nuestra predicación, podemos pasar de un mensaje diario. El P. Danny y yo nos reuniremos para hablar al respecto. Lamentablemente, la cantidad de vistas de estos videos no ha sido abrumadora, por lo que es hora de reevaluarlos.

Sigamos orando el uno por el otro.

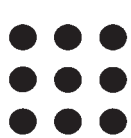
