HERE'S WHAT'S HAPPENIN'

SIXTH GRADE

Green Math— Students will be starting out with a quiz on ratios and proportions this **Thursday**. The group will also be studying percent and how to use them in real-life situations.

Red Math— Students will be studying inequalities and how to use these in real-life situations. This group will be having a quiz next week over solving these problems.

SEVENTH GRADE

Math— Both groups will be having a test near the end of this week. One group is working on ratios and proportions while our other group is working on indirect measurements using similar triangles. It's really encouraging when the students can see how we will use these skills in the real world.

EIGHTH GRADE

Blue Math— Students will be finishing up our systems of equations and we will be going into some basic math skills that will help these students succeed in the real world.
