Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weekend we celebrate the greatest gift God has ever given, the most holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. What is so great about this gift? In the Eucharist, Jesus offers us to God the Father, and God the Father in turn offers us Himself. Our sins, our sufferings, our trials, everything is offered up to the Father through the cross, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

How do we know the Eucharist is truly the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ? Because this is what Jesus told His apostles at the Last Supper.

“While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, ‘Take it; this is my body.’ Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, “This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many.”

When we come to the Altar, we bring our prayers, our temptations, even our venial sins to the Lord. He answers us according to His will. He strengthens us and gives us the grace to resist temptation. He even forgives the venial sins of those who come to Him with a humble and contrite heart.

The problem...many do not know this gift is available to them. They have never heard this message. This is why we are going out with the Eucharist today. This is why the Church encourages Eucharistic processions today. We bring Jesus out of our churches and into the world.

Rather than finishing our procession in the church, we plan to finish it in front of the monastery. This signifies that the final blessing, which we call benediction, is not just intended for those of us who are inside the four walls of the church building. It is intended for our neighbors, all those living in our city, the Archdiocese of Detroit, the state of Michigan, the nation...the blessing extends out to the whole world.

This is why Jesus came into the world. He came to forgive us of our sins, and to bless those who turn to him with an open heart and mind. This is why it is so important for us to go out and tell the Good News of the Gospel to all who are willing to listen.

But how can they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how can they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone to preach? And how can people preach unless they are sent? As it is written, “How beautiful are the feet of those who bring [the] good news!” (Romans 10:14-15)

God gave us a very prophetic vision as a parish. St. Scholastica exists to be a Holy Spirit filled beacon of God's love guiding all into a life changing encounter with Jesus Christ.

This vision begins with our own encounter with Jesus on a daily basis. Jesus is the one who will change lives in and through us who have already encountered Him. Let us continue to pray for an openness to become a joyful band of missionary disciples sent out on mission to unleash the Gospel everywhere God sends us.



STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

(JUNE 5/6 , 2021)

Today's Scripture readings emphasize the old and new covenants. In the Book of Exodus, Moses brings the ancient Israelites to an agreement with God through the sacrificial blood of young bulls. This action prefigures Jesus' ultimate sacrifice on the Cross for our sins, and the opportunity for eternal salvation. The author of the Letter to the Hebrews contrasts Old Testament sacrifices of goats and calves with the new covenant sealed in the very Blood of Christ. In St. Mark's Gospel, the evangelist describes Jesus' institution of the Eucharist at our Lord's Last Supper. This begins the new covenant with His disciples — a covenant that continues for us today. As faithful stewards, we believe in Christ's true presence, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, in Holy Communion. By receiving this tremendous gift, we become what we consume, finding strength to live virtuous and holy lives, deepening our love for God and neighbor in need. Learn when Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction are scheduled in your parish and spend some quiet time with our Lord and Savior..
