**This Weekend there is a 2<sup>nd</sup> Envelope for St Vincent de Paul:** Since the start of the pandemic, SVDP has distributed nearly 70 ton of food to our Brown County neighbors at the pantry and at special pop-ups. Through the generosity of the Brown County Community Foundation, we installed a walk-in cooler/freezer and purchased a refrigerated truck to try to manage our effort. During the year, we also distribute toiletry items, clothing, household items and furniture free of charge to our families. This summer we distributed vouchers to 357 school-age children to purchase back to school shoes, socks and school supplies. We are getting ready to offer our annual Christmas Celebration where parents and grandparents can select gifts for their young ones. Thanksgiving turkey breasts and Christmas Hams are also offered at this time of year. Soon, we anticipate an uptick in requests for utility assistance through our Helping Hands program. St Agnes also has a fund set up for SVdP on our Online Giving. 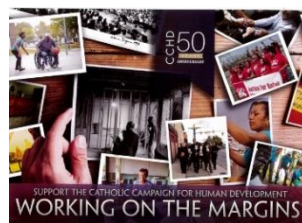

The St. Agnes Guild annual Quilt Raffle will take place on Sunday, December 6, 2020. Parishioners should have received 12 raffle tickets in the mail. The suggested donation is \$1 per ticket or \$5 for 6 tickets. If you did not receive your tickets or would like additional tickets, you may get them by calling or texting Donna Braas at (812) 988-4302 or e-mailing her at djbraas@sbcglobal.net. Also, there is a basket containing blank tickets and return envelopes on the table at the back of the church. You may return your tickets and donation by mail (being sure to put a first-class stamp on the return envelope), by placing the envelope in the collection baskets at the back of the church, or by leaving them at the church office during regular business hours.

The quilt raffle will be the only 2020 fund-raiser for the St. Agnes Guild. The Guild uses funds for various parish group projects that cannot be funded through the regular budget and for community outreach projects.

The raffle is an exempt gaming event approved by the Indiana Gaming Commission. Participants must be at least 18 years old to purchase a ticket or win the prize. As recommended by the Indiana Gaming Commission, "House Rules" have been established for the St. Agnes Quilt Raffle. These rules are posted on the bulletin board at the back of Church and on the Church web site.
