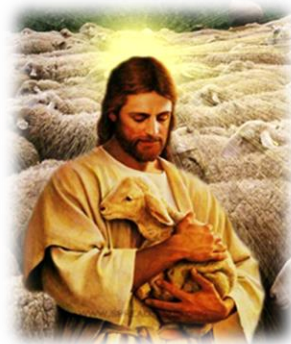

Brown County continues efforts to create affordable housing opportunities that can attract families to locate within the county. This can improve our tax base and address declining school enrollment and funding.

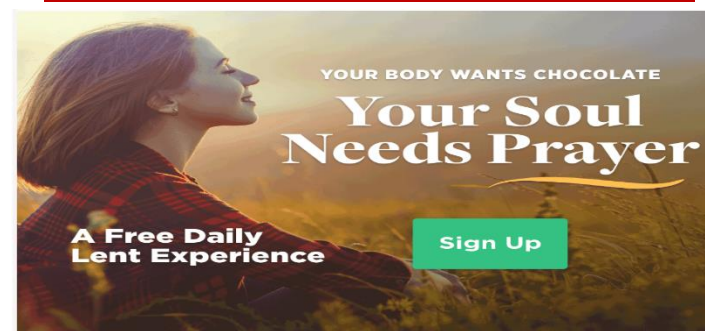

As we enter this Lenten season – a time devoted to fasting, prayer, and penitence – we are faced with the challenge of how to come together during a pandemic to celebrate this season as a community. To help bring us together in a virtual environment, the Hospitality Team is introducing a Lenten Soup Sale to St. Agnes parishioners to help us celebrate our day of fasting together, yet in our own homes. Four different vegetarian soups - made in the St. Agnes kitchens – **are available for \$5 a quart. Tomato Bisque, Vegetable, Black Bean and Great Northern Bean soups are all gluten free, sugar free and dairy free.** The soup will be available after each Mass outside as you exit. There will be a jar for you to drop your money or check into and if you should need change or have questions, a Hospitality Team member will be available to help you. We encourage you to eat this meal with a sense of community, knowing others are enjoying a similar meal in their home. We are providing a prayer to help facilitate the sense of community and hope you will join in praying it before you enjoy your soup.
