

Fellow Saints and Sinners,

Pope Benedict XVI (in harmony with the other four recent popes, including three saints) said, "Christ's entire mission is summed up in this: to baptize (immerse) us in the Holy Spirit." That means Christ's entire mission is to baptize us, including you, in the Holy Spirit. In speaking to people from around the world who have experienced being baptized in the Holy Spirit, Pope Francis said, "What does the pope expect from you? -- to share baptism in the Holy Spirit with everyone in the Church." Again, "everyone" includes all of us, including you. Saint John Paul II said the Church's entire life means going to meet the Spirit, and He can only be invoked and received. He said there is a great struggle going on in us between openness to the Holy Spirit and resistance and opposition to Him. St. Pope John Paul II asks, "Who will win? The one who welcomes the gift." Because of this "struggle," yielding to allow Jesus to baptize us in the Holy Spirit is a process. Join us on Monday Jan. 25 at 7 p.m. to start that process to welcome the Gift.
