COVID SAFETY: recently there has been spikes in covid in people attending funerals or weddings. There was a funeral recently that both in the funeral home and in the church no one wore mask. The priest doing the mass was extremely high risk. He and other clergy attended wore mask. After the funeral there was a rise in cases of a severe nature. To not practice safe distancing, washing hands, mask, etc. is a mortal sin. Mortal sin? Yes selfishness, pride, etc. Or, it is a sin of omission/neglect. There have been incidents of cases spiking with attendees at weddings, and receptions of which they had Covid prior or after. There has been no cases reported of people contracting from attending mass. I am expecting a rise after this weekends group gatherings for Saints game.
