The Sacrament of Reconciliation

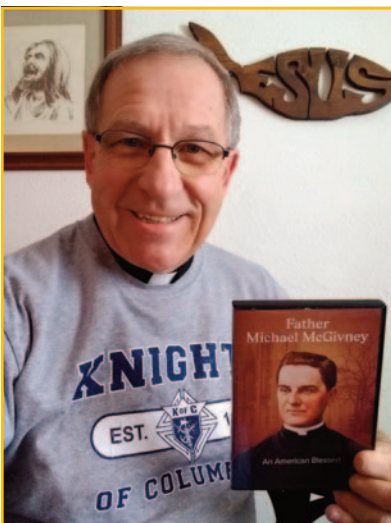
