Timothy describes his most important work as visual translations of the Bible. Although most of his work is based upon a spiritual theme, he also creates large, complex public sculptures in bronze. Timothy strives to create artwork that connects with viewers through design that not only touches the viewer on an emotional level, but also allows them to feel 'part' of the piece.
