-John 6:51*

THE BEGINNING OF EVERYTHING

Everyone recognizes the truth of good proverbs, and so they endure from generation to generation. The Russians have a surprisingly bold one that fits this Sunday's Gospel: "Bread is the beginning of everything."

Judging from the first reading, Elijah might have felt that it was too late for bread—too late for life itself. This great prophet was at the end of his rope and endurance. Then, not one, but two angels visit him. One offers food and drink. The other gives startling directions. For Elijah, this food from the angels is bread for his journey. On the strength of the heaven-sent gift of food, he walks to the mountain of God.

In today's Gospel, Jesus offers himself, not just as bread for the journey, but as bread for life itself. He gives his flesh as life for the world. "I am the bread of life" (John 6:48). He is the beginning of everything

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

In an age given to slogan T-shirts, one of the last bastions of "dressing up" is the wedding. Everyone seems to stretch toward the old ideal of "Sunday best" for these moments. In our tradition, clothing is immensely important. Coming out of the baptismal water, we are immediately vested with a white garment. "You have clothed yourself in Christ," the new Christian is told, and a white garment is the token of being born into God's family. Sadly, this is the last time most Christians wear this garb until their funeral, when the family spreads a pall as a reminder of baptismal identity.

Increasingly today, we are seeing the alb as the proper garb for liturgical ministers, men and women. In ancient Rome, sleeveless tunics of varying colors were worn by everyone, and so at baptism the new Christians could be expected to wear their new garb under their everyday clothes. Sleeves were a problem for ancient Romans, who thought they were a barbarian fashion. As is so often the case, eventually the barbarians won the day, and by the third century the long-sleeved garment worn by ministers today was familiar liturgical garb.

MAY PROFIT & LOSS

The Pastoral Council met June 15, 2015. Minutes were read, corrections made and approved.

Two signs, English and Spanish have been placed on the door of the "Cry-Room" asking parishioners to observe the rules when using the room.

The Bible Sharing Program, led by Lorraine will conclude June 28th. It will resume in the Fall.

There are now five crosses and a spare for the Vocation Prayer Program. Forms are available for sign ups.

Fr. Joyle reported that First Communion and Confirmation went well. Mention was made that there were not enough Extraordinary Ministers for First Communion.

Ann Viernes and Esther Conrad are chairing the White Elephant again this year. Fr. Joyle told the council there is a need for more fundraisers to defray expenses. The Mrs. St. Paul program is being considered again to help expenses for the Youth Program and general expenses.

Dale gave a presentation on last year's Luau. Goal for this year is \$6,000. net, and to sell 304 tickets. Tables reserved only if a full table is purchased. No tickets will be sold at the door.

The Parish Festival is coming up and the Heimericks and Cervantes families have agreed to chair it this year again.

EL COMIENZO DE TODO

Todo el mundo reconoce la verdad de los buenos proverbios, y por eso perduran de generación en generación. Los rusos tienen uno sorprendentemente audaz que le pega al Evangelio de este domingo: "El pan es el comienzo de todo".

De acuerdo a la primera lectura, puede ser que Elías sintiera que era demasiado tarde para ser pan –demasiado tarde para la vida misma. Este gran profeta estaba ya al final de sus fuerzas y de su aguante. Entonces no uno, sino dos ángeles lo visitan. Uno le ofrece comida y bebida. El otro le da unas sorprendentes instrucciones. Para Elías esta comida de los ángeles es pan para su camino. Fortalecido por este regalo celestial de comida, él sigue su camino a la montaña de Dios.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús se ofrece a sí mismo, no sólo como pan para el camino, sino como pan para la vida misma. Él da su carne para dar vida al mundo. "Yo soy el pan de vida" (Juan 6:48). Él es el comienzo de todo.

Tan importante es la resurrección de Cristo que, mientras tenemos cuarenta días de Cuaresma hay cincuenta días de Pascua en el calendario cristiano. Durante esta época, domingo tras domingo mediante la proclamación del Evangelio se nos transmiten escenas de Cristo, quien cada ocho días se aparecía a sus discípulos confirmado cada Domingo que en verdad había resucitado, instruyéndolos para que pudieran ser verdaderos testigos de su resurrección.

Y ¿tú? ¿Cuán buen testigo eres? Un buen testigo da testimonio de lo que ha visto, escuchado y experimentado. Para ser testigo de Cristo hay que verlo, escucharlo y experimentarlo. La Iglesia nos da la oportunidad de verlo, escucharlo y experimentarlo diariamente, en especial durante el domingo. Esto es posible sólo si durante la semana vives con el corazón abierto. Abierto para ver, escuchar y experimentar a Jesús en tu hogar, en tu trabajo, entre tus parientes y amistades.

II PASTORAL EN CONVERSIÓN

No ignoro que hoy los documentos no despiertan el mismo interés que en otras épocas, y son rápidamente olvidados. Nos obstante, destaco que lo que trataré de expresar aquí tiene un sentido programático y consecuencias importantes. Espero que todas las comunidades procuren poner los medios necesarios para avanzar en el camino de una conversión pastoral y misionera, que no puede dejar las cosas como están. Ya no nos sirve una "simple Administración" Constituyámonos en todas la regiones de la tierra en un "estado permanente de misión".

Pablo VI invitó a ampliar el llamado a la renovación, para expresar con fuerza que no se dirige sólo a los individuos aislados, sino a la Iglesia entera. Recordemos este memorable texto que no ha perdido su fuerza interpelante: La Iglesia debe profundizar en la conciencia de sí misma, debe meditar sobre el misterio que le es propio....De esta iluminada y operante conciencia brota un espontáneo deseo de comparar la imagen ideal de la Iglesia- tal como Cristo la vio, la quiso y la amo como Esposa suya santa e inmaculada (cf. Ef. 5:27) y el rostro real que hoy la Iglesia presenta...Brota, por lo tanto, un anhelo generoso y casi impaciente de renovación, es decir, de enmienda de los defectos que denuncia y refleja la conciencia, a modo de examen interior, frente al espejo del modelo que Cristo nos dejó de sí".

El Concilio Vaticano II presentó la conversión eclesial como la apertura a una permanente reforma de sí por fidelidad a Jesucristo: "Toda la renovación de la Iglesia consiste esencialmente en el aumento de la fidelidad a su vocación...Cristo llama a la Iglesia peregrina hacia una perene reforma, de la Iglesia misma. Papa Francisco, exhortación Apostólica
