JOINING THE COMPANY OF BELIEVERS

What will help you to believe? Today's scripture readings tell of faith and doubt. They offer stories "recorded to help you believe," as the passage from John's Gospel (20:31) remarks today. There is an urgency about this. On this Second Sunday of Easter we are challenged to join the company of believers—countless men and women who witnessed the power of the apostles' faith.

There is no doubt that this power comes from Jesus Christ. The second reading, from the book of Revelation, reports John's mystical vision of the Son of Man, who proclaims, "Once I was dead, but now I live" (Revelation 1:18). The Gospel gathers everyone but Thomas to see the Risen Jesus and receive the Holy Spirit from him. Like Thomas, we who have come along later must have faith so that we can have life.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We return to our reflections on the rites of marriage with a brief consideration of reforms from the Council of Trent. When the Protestant Reformation took hold, the fairly recent achievements of the Church in regard to the sacrament of marriage were reviewed with a critical, reforming eye. In general, Protestants returned to an earlier view that marriage was a civil matter, although some said that the civil society had to be in harmony with Christian teaching. In the Catholic Church, the Council of Trent took the question up in 1563, and decided to shore up its teaching on the sacramentality of marriage. They identified many threats to this, including secret marriages and easy divorce. So they enacted laws that still govern our practice today: to be valid, marriage consent must be exchanged in the presence of a priest and two witnesses. Ever since Trent, marriages must also be announced three weeks in advance to the community, and recorded in a register. In some places in the world, the "banns" are still posted in the public square. In the United States, parishes sometimes publish the "banns" in the bulletin.

Anyone who has ever watched a soap opera has seen the standard scene of a minister announcing gravely, "If there is anyone here present who sees any reason why these two should not be married . . ." This bit of drama has no place in the Catholic liturgy, but survives among Protestants who broke with us before Trent edited this cliff-hanger out of our public prayer.

Liturgy Committee approved purchasing 500 small binders to hold the "Order of the Mass" cards and hymns.

New Business:

Research continues to find a low cost option for seasonal hymns. A license is necessary for copying music.

Lenten Program is planned on Palm Sunday, March 27, to be led by Michael Poirier.

There are been several cars broken into during Mass. Announcements will be made to be more careful what you leave valuables visible in your vehicle. Place them in the trunk.

The door monitoring system in the Religious Goods Store has been repaired.

The Wi-Fi Fiber Optics network installation in the church is completed. All that remains is the installation of Access points needed to connect the network to the remote thermostats. Estimated completion is Easter weekend.

Dale Yamamoto presented a strategy and plan to implement Young Adults Ministry, stressing the importance of this ministry.

The Gente Punte is planning several raffles to raise funds for the Spanish Outreach Program. Due to ongoing campaigns this will take place in July.

Members of the Finance Council will make presentations at Mass for the Annual Catholic Appeal, February 20/21.

The Diocese announced a 24 Hours for the Lord Services Friday, March 4 to noon Saturday March in selected parishes. Confessions will be heard during this 24 hour service.

Bible classes will begin again after Easter.

Replacing the Death Penalty

The weekend of April 16/17, we will have a signature collection of Sacramento County registered voters to put an initiative on the ballot to replace the Death Penalty with life without parole. Inmates sentenced, or resentenced to life without parole will never be released. They will die in prison. Moreover if this issue makes the ballot and passes, the inmates will be required to work and pay 60% of their wages to victim's families.

Did you know that Pope Francis called for the death penalty to be abolished worldwide? In February the pope appealed to public officials to "make a courageous and exemplary gesture by seeking a moratorium on executions during this Holy Year of Mercy."

HEALTH MINISTRY

Free Blood Pressure Screening

Sunday, April 3 2016 8:30am-12:30pm in the parish hall. Come to this free clinic and let our parish nurses help you monitor and control your blood pressure. These screenings are presented to increase awareness and knowledge of prevention, detection and management of high blood pressure, known as "the silent killer" as it is possible to exist without any symptoms—and can cause serious problems and even death.

What is high blood pressure ?

High blood pressure is a common condition and is determined by the amount of blood your heart pumps and the amount of resistance to blood flow in your arteries. The more blood your heart pumps and the narrower your arteries, the higher your blood pressure. You can have high blood pressure for years without any symptoms. Uncontrolled this increases your risk of serious health problems, including heart attack and stroke.. Fortunately, high blood pressure can be easily detected. And once you are aware of it you can work with your doctor to control it.

If you are a R.N. or L.V.N. and can give an hour a month to help us provide this service please call Clara at (916)689-3932.

The Health Ministry invites parishioners with medical/clinical training to help perform blood pressure screening at our monthly clinics. You need not commit to full membership in the Health Ministry, but your help would be appreciated if you are experienced in this field. Recent clinics have resulted in long waiting lines and your help would be appreciated.

UNIRSE A LA COMUNIDAD DE CREYENTES

¿Qué te ayudará a tener fe? Las lecturas bíblicas de hoy hablan de la fe y de la duda. Se “escribieron... para que ustedes crean”, como nos dice hoy el pasaje del Evangelio de san Juan (20:31). Tiene esto una cierta urgencia. En este Segundo Domingo de Pascua se nos lanza un desafío a unirnos a la comunidad de creyentes –un sinnúmero de hombres y mujeres que dan testimonio del poder de la fe de los Apóstoles.

No hay duda que este poder viene de Jesucristo. La segunda lectura, del libro del Apocalipsis, relata la visión mística de Juan sobre el Hijo del Hombre, el cual proclama: “Estuve muerto y de nuevo soy el que vive” (Apocalipsis 1:18). El Evangelio reúne a todos excepto a Tomás para ver a Jesús resucitado y recibir de él el Espíritu Santo. Al igual que Tomás, los que hemos llegado más tarde debemos tener fe para poder tener vida.

LECTURAS DE HOY

Primera lectura — Los apóstoles hacen muchas señales y maravillas entre la gente. (Hch 5:12-16).

Salmo — La misericordia del Señor es eterna. Aleluya (Salmo 118 [117]).

Segunda lectura — Juan, contagiado por el Espíritu, tiene una visión del Señor glorificado (Apocalipsis 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19).

Evangelio — Jesús resucitado visita a los discípulos con su paz y con el Espíritu. Tomás, ausente, duda de la aparición de Jesús (Juan 20:19-31).

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La Iglesia católica es universal, extendida en diversas naciones y culturas. A través de los siglos estas culturas han enriquecido la Tradición de la Iglesia con muchas tradiciones y devociones que van más allá de su cultura de origen. La fiesta de la Divina Misericordia es un buen ejemplo. Viene de una devoción que nació en Polonia con la Hermana Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938) canonizada en el 2000.

La devoción a la Divina Misericordia se celebra el Segundo Domingo de Pascua y durante todo el año orando la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia. En latinoamérica se ha ido extendiendo esta devoción desde 1978 cuando fue aprobada por el Papa Paulo VI. En todas partes se puede encontrar la imagen de la Divina Misericordia, Jesús de pie con rayos rojos y blanco-azules que brillan desde su corazón hacia el mundo. Lleva el lema: Jesús, confío en ti.

La finalidad de esta devoción es recordar al pecador que la misericordia de Dios es infinita e inagotable. Es una misericordia que debemos imitar para que la paz pueda reinar en nuestros corazones y en nuestra tierra.

DESPUES DE LA RESURRECCION

3 Cosas que hizo Jesús después de la Resurrección: Hecho de los Apóstoles 1:03 nos dice que después de la resurrección se produjo un periodo de cuarenta días en los que Jesús se apareció a sus discípulos:

1) Jesús restauró la fe de sus Discípulos y les dio Esperanza.- La crucifixión de Jesús devastó a sus seguidores. Mateo 19, 27 Pedro dice: “Nosotros hemos dejado todo por seguirte” Y en Juan 6, 68 dijo: “Señor, ¿A donde iremos si Tú tienes palabras de vida eterna?”

“En Juan 20:9 también vemos de que ellos” no habían entendido las Escrituras que Jesús debía resucitar de entre los muertos”. Desde el punto de vista de sus seguidores, mientras Jesús estaba siendo crucificado, todo lo que habían esperado y creído moría ante sus propios ojos.

2) Jesús enseñó a sus discípulos como las Escrituras hablan de El.— Como hemos visto ante los seguidores de Jesús no entendían lo que dice la Escritura acerca de El. Es por eso que una vez que Jesús restauró la fe de ellos esta se compartió por toda la tierra a través de las Escrituras.

3) Jesús envía a sus discípulos a compartir el Evangelio (La Buena Nueva).— Con su fe restaurada y fortalecida. Las últimas instrucciones de Jesús a sus apóstoles en Mateo 28,19 era: “ id y hacer discípulos a todas las naciones” bautícelos en el Nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. Enseñeles a cumplir todo lo que yo les he enseñado.
