### FOLLOWING IN THE FOOTSTEPS OF CHRIST

The great fifty-day celebration of Easter has concluded, as have the feasts honoring the Holy Trinity and the Body and Blood of Christ. Last week we began a long stretch of Ordinary Time that will bring us to late November. Saint Paul tells us today that those who are baptized "have clothed yourselves with Christ" (Galatians 3:27). This scripture is echoed in the Church's baptism ritual when we sing, "You have put on Christ, in him you have been baptized."

This message is inspiring and sobering at the same time, for in today's Gospel, we get to the heart of what it means to be clothed in Christ. The Lord tells us, "If anyone wishes to come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). For the next twenty-two weeks we are called to take up the cross and, with Saint Luke as our guide, follow in the footsteps of Christ.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

It's almost midsummer day! One of the great hidden treasures of our liturgical calendar occurs this week. There are only three "nativity" feasts on our calendar: for the Lord, the Blessed Mother (September 8), and the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist on June 24. Friday's date is anchored by the Annunciation (March 25), when Mary learns not only of her own child's advent, but of Elizabeth's child. We are exactly half a year away from Christmas Eve. There are strong traditions around this feast. Just as the winter solstice provides a rich vocabulary for Christmas, so does the abundance of light at midsummer inform this celebration. Just as at Christmas, a religious festival spills over into culture. As summer light reaches its peak, the sun-drenched zones of northern Europe see people staying up all night, kindling "St. John's Fires" in the long summer twilight. Bonfires seem to be the unifying force in all these celebrations, kindled along the shores of the St. Lawrence in Quebec and Montreal, with harbor illuminations in France. You may be most interested in the custom in San Juan, Puerto Rico, the Baptist's own city. People there will leap into the sea between midnight and dawn to honor John. Why not find your way to a pool, a lake, or a sandy beach this week and plunge in to recall your baptism? It's a tradition!

**SOCIAL JUSTICE**

**CIA Torture**

During June, Torture Awareness Month, it should be noted that last year the US Senate took a bipartisan vote to end CIA torture. They voted on the McCain-Feinstein Amendment to the National Defense Authorization Act. For people of faith this vote expressed a widely held moral principle that torture is morally wrong.

Our Catholic Church reminds us that torture is never justified. It is wrong. As Christians, we are called to be people of compassion and to follow the way of Christ in our lives.

**Bottled Water**

The Social Justice Ministry continues to collect bottled water for those living on the streets. Can you imagine how hot and thirsty the homeless men and women must be during the summer months? Containers for your donations are in the entryways of the church.

**End of Life**

On June 9th, in what the Bishops of California have called a "travesty of compassion." physicians in California were legally allowed to prescribe a lethal dose of drugs to a patient. The hastening of death by a physician is such a fundamental shift in the doctor-patient relationship that Catholic hospitals and may other secular healthcare providers, such as hospice programs and physicians, have already stated that they will not participate in that law.

## HEALTH MINISTRY

### SUMMER HEAT—Another silent killer

One of the biggest health hazards effecting our region during the summer is heat.

We don't realize how deadly heat can be. In contrast to the visible, destructive and violent nature of fire, floods and earthquakes, heat is another "silent killer," Human bodies dissipate heat by varying the rate and depth of blood circulation, by losing water through the skin and sweat glands.

The body does everything it can to maintain 98.6 degrees inside. Heat disorders happen when the body can't maintain that temperature. Disorders can range from simple discomfort to serious injury and even death, e.g. sunburn, heat cramps, exhaustion or heat stroke. They all share one common feature, a person has overexposed or over exercised for his or her age, physical condition and the weather.

Reduce your chances of disorders by following a few simple steps:

Slow Down—reduce strenuous activities or reschedule them to a cooler time of day.

Dress for summer—lightweight, light colored clothing, cover all exposed skin with high SPF sunscreen and wear a wide brimmed hat.

Drink plenty of water, avoid caffeine,, soda and fruit juices.

Check on the elderly, young children and people with health problems or disabilities.

Keep pets indoors or provide them with shade and plenty of water. Do not leave pets, or anyone else in a closed, parked vehicle

## Décimosegundo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 19 de junio 2016

### SEGUIR LOS PASOS A CRISTO

La gran celebración de cincuenta días de la Pascua ha concluido, al igual que las fiestas en honor a la Santísima Trinidad y al Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. La semana pasada comenzamos el largo tramo del Tiempo Ordinario que nos llevará hasta el final de noviembre. San Pablo nos dice hoy que los que han sido bautizados “se han revestido de Cristo” (Gálatas 3:27). ### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Según san Mateo, una noche mientras los discípulos estaban en la barca de Pedro, Jesús vino hacia ellos caminando sobre el mar. Ellos se espantaron creyendo que era un fantasma de algún pescador pero él los calmó diciendo “¡Ánimo!, que soy yo; no teman”. Debí ser impactante ver al Señor caminar sobre las aguas, especialmente en una época donde las aguas venían consideradas como el caos.

En varias partes de latinoamerica los fieles celebran a distintos santos con procesiones de barcos sobre ríos o mares. En el Puerto de Paita, Perú se llevan a los santos Pedro y Pablo en una procesión acuática. San Pedro, que fue pescador, está en casa sobre la barca, ya que normalmente son barcas de pescadores las que forman la procesión. Esta procesión reconoce el caos del mar reconociendo a los pescadores, que durante el año perdieron sus vidas en el mar, con guirnaldas lanzadas a la bahía. Pero, esta procesión no se espanta del mar ya que es una fiesta en honor de dos siervos de aquel que camina sobre las aguas, dominando el mar.

### VISITANTE PREDICADOR

El fin de semana de Junio 18 y 19, tendremos un visitante que es el Padre Charles Talley ofm, sacerdote franciscano; y estará predicando en todas las misas en nombre de la Misión Cooperativa de apelaciones, patrocinado por la Sociedad de la Propagación de la Fe. Habrá una segunda colecta para apoyar este esfuerzo. P. Charles, que es actualmente Director de Comunicaciones de los frailes franciscanos de California (Provincia de Santa Bárbara) y vive en Danville. Su propia experiencia personal ha sido misionero en Guatemala y Centro América.

### Fiesta de San Pedro y San Pablo

Como en el siglo cuarto se celebraba una fiesta en memoria de los Santos Pedro y Pablo en el mismo día, aunque el día no era el mismo en Oriente que en Roma. El Martirologio Sirio de fines del siglo cuarto, que es un extracto de un catálogo Griego de santos del Asia Menor, indica las siguientes fiestas en conexión con la Navidad (25 de diciembre): 26 dic. San Esteban; 27 dic. Santos Santiago y Juan; 28 dic. Santos Pedro y Pablo. La fiesta principal de los Santos Pedro y Pablo se mantuvo en Roma el 29 de junio tan antiguo como en el tercero o cuarto siglo. La lista de fiestas de mártires en el Cronógrafo de Filócalo coloca esta nota en la fecha - La fecha 258 en las notas revela que a partir de ese año se celebraba la memoria de los dos Apóstoles el 29 de junio en la Vía Apia ad Catacumbas (cerca de San Sebastiano fuori le mura), pues en esta fecha los restos de los Apóstoles fueron trasladado allí. Más tarde, quizá al construirse la iglesia sobre las tumbas en el Vaticano y en la Vía Ostiensis, los restos fueron restituidos a su anterior lugar de descanso: los de Pedro a la Basílica Vaticana y los de Pablo la iglesia en la Vía Ostipenses. En los países latino americanos se celebra esta fiesta con diferentes actividades.

### MINISTERIO DE JUSTICIA SOCIAL

**EL CALOR DEL VERANO-ES OTRO "ASESINO SILENCIOSO".**— Uno de los mayores riesgos para la salud que afectan a nuestra región durante el verano es el calor.

No nos damos cuenta de lo mortal que puede ser el calor. En contraste con la naturaleza visible, destructiva y violenta de incendios, inundaciones y terremotos, el calor es otro "asesino silencioso" Los cuerpos humanos disipan el calor variando la velocidad y la profundidad de la circulación sanguínea, por la pérdida de agua a través de las glándulas de la piel y el sudor.

El cuerpo hace todo lo posible para mantener el interior de 98,6 grados. trastornos por calor ocurre cuando el cuerpo no puede mantener esa temperatura. Trastornos pueden ir desde simples molestias a lesiones graves e incluso la muerte, por ejemplo, quemaduras solares, calambres por calor, agotamiento o golpe de calor. Todos comparten una característica común, una persona ha sobreexposto o más de ejercicio por su edad, condición física y el tiempo.

Reducir las probabilidades de trastornos siguiendo unos sencillos pasos:

Reducir las actividades extenuantes o reprogramar a continuación, a un tiempo más fresco del día. Vestirse con ropa de colores claros-ligero del verano, cubrir toda la piel expuesta con alta protección solar SPF y use un sombrero de ala ancha. Beber mucha agua, evitar la caféina, jugos de frutas y gaseosas. proteger a las personas mayores, niños pequeños y personas con problemas de salud o discapacidad.

Mantenga a las mascotas en el interior o proporcionarles sombra y mucha agua. No deje a las mascotas, Bebes o cualquier otra persona en un vehículo estacionado y cerrado, el calor del carro se duplica y mata rápidamente.
