A HUMBLE KING

Like a tonal center in music, the note to which we keep returning in today's readings is humility. We wait in joyful expectation for the coming of our Lord as King.

But what we are told to expect and rejoice over is a meek and humble king, riding on an ass. Not horses or chariots of the great and mighty, but a humble beast carries the Ruler whose dominion stretches "from the River to the ends of the earth" (Zechariah 9:10). This King comes to banish the tools of the warrior and bring peace. No wonder that a weary world rejoices and gives thanks to God!

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

The premier poet of the English language, Geoffrey Chaucer, introduced one of his most beloved characters, the "Wife of Bath," by this telling remark: "Husbands at church door she had five." Four times widowed, she was setting off on a pilgrimage, notably without number five. The church door is a curious detail, pointing to the fourteenth-century wedding custom of marrying on the porch of the parish church.

The goal was to give maximum publicity to the consent of the groom and bride, and so consent was moved from the bride's home to a public venue. The priest would stand in the doorway and begin by sprinkling the couple with holy water. He needed to make sure they weren't too closely related and give them some instruction. He would direct the groom to pay the bride's family a dowry, and then announce the monetary amounts to the interested passersby. Only then would the guests enter the church for the wedding Mass, during which the bride and groom would hold lighted candles. The gradual move from home to church and the shift from the bride's father to the priest's authority helped to protect the freedom of brides who weren't quite as confident as the Wife of Bath.

OUR DREAM CONTINUES

Campaign Update!

When our campaign ended in June of 2016 our outstanding loan from the Diocese for the Religious Education Center was **\$849,235.64**. Pledge payments and "Pink Envelope" contributions have allowed us to repay **\$209,936.61** as of June, 2017. Our current balance is **\$639,299.03**.

In addition to the amount we have repaid we have also incurred and paid approximately **\$20,563.39** in interest charges.

Thank you to all those who made pledges and are fulfilling their commitment, and parishioners who continue to use their "Pink Envelopes."

Bishop Soto's ONE CAMPAIGN update!

Our campaign had two parts, the repayment of our loan and a required contribution to the Diocesan ONE CAMPAIGN, conducted to provide support for Catholic education, care for retired Diocesan priests, improve our ability to communicate with our Spanish speaking community, and provide for social services and expand youth ministry opportunities. Our allotted contribution is **\$158,600**.

As of May, 2017, we have paid **\$52,866.68**, leaving us a balance of **\$105,733.32**.

HEALTH MINISTRY

SUMMER HEAT—Another silent killer

One of the biggest health hazards effecting our region during the summer is heat.

We don't realize how deadly heat can be. In contrast to the visible, destructive and violent nature of fire, floods and earthquakes, heat is another "silent killer," Human bodies dissipate heat by varying the rate and depth of blood circulation, by losing water through the skin and sweat glands.

The body does everything it can to maintain 98.6 degrees inside. Heat disorders happen when the body can't maintain that temperature. Disorders can range from simple discomfort to serious injury and even death, e.g. sunburn, heat cramps, exhaustion or heat stroke. They all share one common feature, a person has overexposed or over exercised for his or her age, physical condition and the weather.

Reduce your chances of disorders by following a few simple steps:

Slow Down—reduce strenuous activities or reschedule them to a cooler time of day.

Dress for summer—lightweight, light colored clothing, cover all exposed skin with high SPF sunscreen and wear a wide brimmed hat.

Drink plenty of water, avoid caffeine,, soda and fruit juices.

Check on the elderly, young children and people with health problems or disabilities.

Keep pets indoors or provide them with shade and plenty of water. Do not leave pets, or anyone else in a closed, parked vehicle

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En el año 2001, Carlos Manuel Rodríguez Santiago se convirtió en el primer laico caribeño beatificado por la Iglesia. Su vida fue ejemplar en la caridad y en el amor a la liturgia, pues promovió la participación de los fieles de una manera activa, mucho antes de que el Concilio Vaticano II así lo pidiera. En 1963 una colitis rectal muy severa lo llevó a los brazos de Cristo resucitado, a la edad de 44 años.

Carlitos, como muchos lo llaman, trabajó en la Universidad de Puerto Rico y fundó un grupo apostólico laical en el Centro Católico de dicha universidad. Allí pudo obrar por el desarrollo del humanismo cristiano, la participación activa de los laicos en la liturgia de la Iglesia y por la renovación de la Vigilia Pascual. Solía decir que los cristianos “vivimos para esa noche” como cumbre y centro de nuestra fe.

Carlitos es modelo para los laicos comprometidos con su fe. Él insistía no sólo en una participación activa en la pastoral de la Iglesia, sino también en la liturgia de la Iglesia en una época donde la Misa todavía se consideraba obra exclusiva de los sacerdotes.

MINISTERIO DE SALUD

CALOR DE VERANO - Otro asesino silencioso
Uno de los mayores peligros para la salud que afectan nuestra región durante el verano es el calor. No nos damos cuenta de cómo el calor puede ser mortal. En contraste con la naturaleza visible, destructiva y violenta del fuego, las inundaciones y los terremotos, el calor es otro "asesino silencioso", los cuerpos humanos disipan el calor al variar la velocidad y la profundidad de la circulación sanguínea, perdiendo agua a través de la piel y las glándulas sudoríparas.

El cuerpo hace todo lo posible para mantener 98.6 grados en su interior. Los trastornos del calor ocurren cuando el cuerpo no puede mantener esa temperatura. Los trastornos pueden variar desde molestias simples hasta lesiones graves e incluso muerte, Quemaduras de sol, calambres por calor, agotamiento o golpe de calor. Todos comparten una característica común, una persona que se ha sobre expuesto más ejercicios por su edad, condición física o climática.

Reduzca sus probabilidades de sufrir trastornos siguiendo algunos sencillos pasos: Reduzca la velocidad: reduzca las actividades extenuantes o vuelva a programarlas a una hora más fresca del día.

Vestido de verano-ligero, ropa de color claro, cubrir toda la piel expuesta con protector solar de alta SPF y usar un sombrero de ala ancha. Beba mucha agua, evite la cafeína, refrescos y jugos de frutas.

Compruebe sobre los ancianos, los niños pequeños y las personas con problemas de salud o discapacidades. Mantenga las mascotas en el interior o proporcionarles sombra y mucha agua. No deje mascotas, ni a nadie en un vehículo cerrado y estacionado es mortal.
