THE HEAVENLY BANQUET

The mountain of the Lord described in today's first reading is a place where there is no more hunger, no more weeping, and no more division of any kind. We need to pause and ponder these images every now and then, especially given the fact that we live in such a fractured world. The responsorial psalm continues to paint a picture of a place where only goodness and kindness flourish.

These readings describe the heavenly banquet, to which God calls each of us through baptism and continues to call us throughout our lives. Let us "RSVP" to God's invitation and live our lives consistent with gospel values so that one day we will be welcomed to the table of the kingdom.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

In 1971, the Vatican Congregation for Divine Worship completed a survey of the presidents of the national liturgical commissions around the world. How were children doing in the liturgical reform? Probably to their surprise, the cardinals learned of special weekday Masses for children designed to teach them how to participate on Sunday, Masses with separate components for children.

The decision was made quickly to develop adaptations for Masses where children were a majority of the assembly. Changes would include a simpler structure, understandable texts, a simplified Lectionary, more active participation, and most surprisingly, new Eucharistic Prayers. By 1973 the work was done, and with very specific advice from Pope Paul VI, including the need for two new Eucharistic Prayers, the *Directory for Masses with Children* was published on December 20, a timely Christmas gift for the children of the world.

The prayers are the first to be written fresh in a modern language—not Latin, but French and German—then translated into English, Italian, and Spanish. With a sense of caution, these new prayers were approved for three years, until 1977, but it soon became apparent that they had truly been embraced.

100TH ANNIVERSARY OF OUR LADY OF FATIMA

As we welcome the season of Autumn, we direct special attention to the month of October and recall the sixth and last apparition of Our Lady at the Cova da Iria on October 13th, 1917. It was in the midst of the darkness of World War I, and the social and political upheaval which threatened the existence of the Catholic Church in Portugal, that "the Lady clothed in light" appeared to the three little shepherd children. Our Lady promised that on the 13th day she would perform a miracle so that all may believe. This last appearance of our Lady at Fatima would bring peace and an end to WW I. The event, which was to occur at the Cova, in the midst of the most inhospitable conditions of drenching rain and cold, would transform the lives of all waiting in anticipation of "the miracle."

The following is the eyewitness account of the last Apparition on October 13, 1917, in the words of Sr. Lucia dos Santos, visionary of Fatima, *Bishop Myron Cotta*

We left home quite early, expecting that we would be delayed along the way. Masses of people thronged the roads. The rain fell in torrents. My mother, her heart torn with uncertainty as to what was going to happen, and fearing it would be the last day of my life, wanted to accompany me.

On the way, the scenes of the previous month, still more numerous and moving, were repeated. Not even the muddy roads could prevent these people from kneeling in the most humble and supplicant of attitudes. We reached the holmoak in the Cova da Iria. Once there, moved by an interior impulse, I asked the people to shut their umbrellas and say the Rosary. A little later, we saw the flash of light, and then Our Lady appeared on the holmoak.

"What do you want of me?"

"I want to tell you that a chapel is to be built here in my honor. I am the Lady of the Rosary. Continue to pray the Rosary every day. The war is going to end, and the soldiers will soon return to their homes."

"I have many things to ask you: the cure of some sick persons, the conversion of sinners, and other things..."

"Some yes, but not others. They must amend their lives and ask forgiveness for their sins."

Looking very sad, Our Lady said:

"Do not offend the Lord our God any more, Because He is already much offended."

Then, opening her hands, she made them reflect on the sun, and as she ascended, the reflection of her own light continued to be projected on the sun itself. (It was at this moment the rain stopped and the clouds parted that the 70,000 present witnessed the supernatural solar phenomena.) While they experienced the awe inspiring and terrifying event the shepherd children witnessed something entirely different.....*to be continued.....*

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

En 2006, en la plaza de Taos se erigió una estatua de bronce que conmemora al “cura de Taos”, Antonio José Martínez, un sacerdote recordado como controversial ante varios gobiernos por defender a su pueblo.

Él fue sacerdote en Taos, Nuevo México cuando era territorio español, luego mexicano y finalmente cuando pasa a manos de EE. UU. Durante la época española y mexicana Antonio estableció escuelas para niños y niñas y fundó un seminario para preparar un clero nativo. En 1830 empezó a imprimir libros y estableció el primer periódico Nuevo Mexicano. De esta manera estableció Taos como un centro de educación.

En 1851 llegaron los representantes del gobierno estadounidense con la intención de “americanizar” a los nuevos mexicanos prohibiéndoles sus tradiciones declarando que eran ignorantes y supersticiosas.

Antonio José contradujo este movimiento convirtiendo su seminario en una escuela de leyes. Decía que el gobierno de EE. UU es un burro que debe ser montado por abogados. Muchos se opusieron a su obra pero él continuó luchando por su pueblo hasta su muerte en 1867. Su tumba lo declara: “La honra de su país”.

MEDITEMOS

Al que llama, se le abre la puerta

Cristo dice a los doctores de la Ley. Malditos vosotros porque habéis quitado la llave del conocimiento. ¿Qué es la llave del conocimiento sino la gracia del Espíritu Santo dada por la fe, que por la iluminación da el pleno conocimiento y abre la puerta a nuestro espíritu cerrado y velado? La puerta es el Hijo: *Yo soy la puerta dice él mismo*. La llave de la puerta es el Espíritu Santo: *Recibid el Espíritu Santo: a los que perdonéis los pecados, les serán perdonados, a los que se les retengáis, se les serán retenidos*. La casa es el Padre: *porque en la casa de mi Padre hay muchas estancias*. Si la puerta no se abre, nadie entra a la casa del Padre, como dice Cristo: *nadie va al Padre sino por mí*.

Ahora bien, el Espíritu mismo nos ha dicho que es el primero que abre nuestro espíritu y nos enseña todo lo que se refiere al Padre y al Hijo: *Cuando venga el espíritu de la verdad que procede del Padre, él dará testimonio de mí y os guiará hasta la verdad plena*.

Por el Espíritu, o mejor aún, en el Espíritu, el Padre y el Hijo se dan a conocer inseparablemente. En efecto, si llamamos “llave” al Espíritu Santo, es que por él y en él Se nos da tener el espíritu iluminado con la luz del conocimiento, y por él somos purificados y bautizados, regenerados y hechos hijos de Dios, tal como dice Pablo; *El mismo Espíritu intercede por nosotros con gemidos inefables*.
