STRENGTH AGAINST TEMPTATION

The first Sunday of the season of Lent always includes a Gospel account of the temptation of the Lord Jesus in the desert by the devil. This year, the story is set against the backdrop of the first reading from Genesis, which recounts the very first temptation by the devil. That story is set in a garden of delight. The Gospel story is set in the desert.

As believers, we know that temptation comes our way in our own gardens of delight as well as the deserts of our lives. As Lent begins, our attention is drawn to that temptation within each of us to become like God—we want control, power, and answers to all of life's difficult questions. As communities of faith, we are given this season of repentance so that we can join our hearts with others on the difficult journey of conversion. We look to God and to one another for strength against temptation.

SAINT KATHARINE DREXEL

SAINT KATHARINE DREXEL (1858-1955)
March 3

Born into Philadelphia society, Katharine was an infant when she lost her mother. Her father remarried and the couple taught their daughters that their wealth was a "gift on loan" to be shared with the poor, whom they fed and cared for in their home. Invited by priest friends to witness firsthand the destitution on Native American reservations, Katharine resolved to devote her inheritance to this apostolate and enter a contemplative order.

When, however, in private audience, she begged Leo XIII to send missionaries to staff the schools she was building, the pope replied, "My child, why not become a missionary yourself?" Katharine renounced a twenty-million-dollar fortune and founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, adoring Christ present in the Eucharist and ministering to Christ suffering in victims of racial discrimination.

Her Sisters established over sixty schools nationwide, including Xavier University, New Orleans, the first dedicated to professional education for African Americans. In 2000, John Paul II canonized "Mother Drexel," praising her "excellent example of practical charity and generous solidarity with the less fortunate, long the distinguishing mark of American Catholics."

Lent began on Ash Wednesday Feb. 26

**Lenten Regulations:
Fasting & Abstinence**

All persons 14 years and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent:

Everyone from 18-59 is obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent is highly encouraged. Fasting is generally understood to mean that one full meal may be eaten. Two other small meals may be eaten but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted but liquids are allowed.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected neither fasting or abstinence is obliged. Airport workers, travelers and others while on board ships or airplanes are dispensed from the laws of fasting for the duration of their journey.

Other forms of fasting include abstinence from alcoholic beverages, television, video games, the internet and social media is spiritually beneficial and strongly encouraged.

Stations of the Cross will begin on Friday, March 8th at 6:00pm and will continue every Friday throughout the Lenten Season

This will be followed by a simple meal in the parish hall.

HEALTH MINISTRY

Got a Cold?

More than 100 viruses can cause colds, the world's most common illness, and most people average about three colds every year. Once it enters the body the cold virus begins to multiply, causing sore throat, sneezing, runny nose, watery eyes, aches and pains, mild fever, nasal congestion and coughing.

Over-the-counter cough and cold remedies may relieve some of the symptoms, but they will not prevent, cure or even shorten the course of the illness.

To lessen your chances of coming down with a cold keep up your natural resistance through good nutrition, and getting enough sleep and exercise. Avoid direct contact with those who have colds, and wash your hands frequently.

If you get a cold be respectful of others, cover your coughs and sneezes.

FORTALEZA ANTE LA TENTACIÓN

SANT CATALINA DREXEL (1858-1955)

Nació en Filadelfia, en el seno de una familia muy rica. Debido a la muerte inesperada de su madre, su padre contrajo nupcias por segunda vez. De ambos aprendió a orar y a cuidar de los pobres y su mismo hogar se abrió para ellos. Puesto que era muy rica tuvo la oportunidad de viajar a los Estados Unidos y este viaje le transformó para siempre, pues pudo presenciar la discriminación y sufrimiento a que eran sometidos los afroamericanos y nativos americanos. Años después, renunció a una fortuna de 14 millones de dólares (250 millones actualmente) y se unió a las Hermanas de la Misericordia. Posteriormente fundó la Congregación de las Hermanas del Santísimo Sacramento, añadiendo a los votos religiosos uno muy especial: el cuidado y educación de afroamericanos y nativos americanos.

Al momento de su muerte se habían construido 50 misiones en 16 estados, un sistema de escuelas para afroamericanos, 40 centros misioneros y 23 escuelas rurales. Gracias a ella se construyó la Universidad Xavier, en Nuevo Orleans, la primera dedicada a la educación profesional de afroamericanos.

Reglamento Cuaresmal: Ayuno y abstinencia

Todas las personas mayores de 14 años están obligadas a abstenerse de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza y todos los viernes de Cuaresma:

Todos de 18 a 59 años están obligados a ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Se recomienda encarecidamente el ayuno voluntario en otros días de la semana de Cuaresma. Por lo general, se entiende que ayunar significa que se puede comer una comida completa. Se pueden comer otras dos comidas pequeñas, pero juntas no deberían equivaler a una comida completa. No se permite comer entre comidas, pero se permiten líquidos.

Cuando la salud o la capacidad para trabajar se verían seriamente afectadas, no se obliga ni al ayuno ni a la abstinencia. Los trabajadores del aeropuerto, los viajeros y otras personas que se encuentren a bordo de barcos o aviones están exentos de las leyes de ayuno durante la duración de su viaje.

Otras formas de ayuno incluyen la abstinencia de las bebidas alcohólicas, la televisión, los videojuegos, Internet y las redes sociales. Es espiritualmente beneficioso y altamente alentador.
