Fourth Sunday of Lent
March 22, 2020

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.
— Psalm 23:1

LIGHT

“Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light” (Ephesians 5:14). We are at the midpoint of our Lenten journey of conversion. As always, God never gives up on us, especially those who have “fallen asleep” along the road to conversion.

The most powerful stories of conversion are proclaimed during these final weeks of Lent. They have the power to shake us out of our sleep. Today’s Gospel story of the healing of the man born blind exposes the real blindness in the time of Christ—the blindness of the self-righteous religious leaders. In a few weeks, at the Easter Vigil, the Church will proclaim “Christ our Light” as the paschal candle is carried into darkened churches throughout the world.

May the darkness of sin that still pervades our lives, communities, and world, be dispelled by the Christ who comes to bring sight to the blind and light to the world. .

SAINT TURIBIUS OF MOGROVEJO (1538– 1601)

In times of crisis, God always surprises the Church with unlikely saints, through whom Christ’s light radiates beyond their local communities to illumine the universal Church. Charles Borromeo was such a saint: appointed Archbishop of Milan at twenty-one by his papal uncle, epitomizing the corruption that the reformers condemned, Charles instead inspired a revival that reinvigorated a Church devastated by the Reformation.

His less well-known contemporary, Turibius of Mogrovejo, was God’s “saintly surprise” in the New World. Spanish-born lawyer, professor, head of the feared Inquisition, Turibius was still a layman when a grateful king appointed him Archbishop of far-off Lima.

Once in Peru, however, Turibius was appalled at the abuse of indigenous peoples by the occupying conquistadores—his fellow countrymen—and by the complicity of the clergy. He became the natives’ devoted advocate, building churches, schools, hospitals, and the first seminary in the Americas, publishing catechisms and prayer-books in the native languages he painstakingly mastered.

Four hundred years later, whenever Pope Benedict welcomed Latin American bishops to Rome, he always invoked “the shining example of San Toribio.”

LENT**Lenten Regulations:****Fasting & Abstinence**

All persons 14 years and older are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent:

Everyone from 18-59 is obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent is highly encouraged. Fasting is generally understood to mean that one full meal may be eaten. Two other small meals may be eaten but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted but liquids are allowed.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected neither fasting or abstinence is obliged. Airport workers, travelers and others while on board ships or airplanes are dispensed from the laws of fasting for the duration of their journey.

Other forms of fasting include abstinence from alcoholic beverages, television, video games, the internet and social media is spiritually beneficial and strongly encouraged.

Stations of the Cross began on Friday, March 8th at 6:00pm and will continue every Friday throughout the Lenten Season

This will be followed by a simple meal in the parish hall.

HEALTH MINISTRY

Hand Sanitizer vs Handwashing: Which is better?

Every time you touch an object or shake someone's hand, you are picking up bacteria and potential viruses too. It has been estimated that around 1500 bacteria are living on each square centimeter of skin on our hands. Areas such as underneath the fingernails and between the fingers often harbor even more. It is very easy for these germs and viruses to make their way to your mouth, nose and eyes and make you sick.

Hand Sanitizer

These are available in various forms. It is important that the type you choose contains a minimum of 60% alcohol. While being effective they don't kill all the germs. They do however remove them from your hands. To use effectively apply to the palm of the hand then rub it all over your hands until they are dry covering all parts of your hands and nails.

Handwashing

Proper handwashing is the "gold standard" to removing and killing germs on our hands. Any soap that lathers works in killing and removing germs. When washing your hands use warm water as it removes germs better than cold water. Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds, as it's the rubbing of your hands together that removes the germs. Additionally remember to dry your hands completely. If your hands are still wet you will pick up and transmit germs very easily.

SANTO TORIBIO DE MOGROVEJO (1538-1606)

Toribio nació en Mallorca, España y desde muy joven mostró un interés y conocimiento notable del derecho civil llegando a ser profesor de Derecho en Salamanca y juez inquisitorio. Siendo laico recibió el nombramiento de Arzobispo de Lima, por pedido del rey Felipe II al Papa Gregorio XIII. Llegó a Lima, Perú en 1581 y quedó sorprendido al ser testigo de los abusos de los conquistadores y la poca atención del clero hacia los pobres, pues se habían puesto del lado de los opresores.

Esta situación le conmovió tanto que fue el primero en convocar un concilio de obispos en América; como fruto del mismo concilio se logró la impresión de catecismos y libros de texto en el idioma vernáculo, promoviendo además, una renovación en la vida de los sacerdotes. Visitó todas las comunidades de su diócesis en tres ocasiones, sufriendo los embates del clima, el hambre y la falta de mapas. Además de fundar hospitales y el primer seminario de América, fue quien trajo justicia y paz al Nuevo Mundo. Se le honra como el santo patrono de los obispos latinoamericanos.

MEDIDAS PREVENTIVAS ANTE CORONAVIRUS

Para prevenir el contagio, Del coronavirus recomienda evitar el contacto con personas que padezcan infecciones respiratorias agudas. Cubrirse la boca al toser y al estornudar, utilizar mascarillas y desinfectar las superficies que toca con frecuencia.

"El lavado de manos es esencial, tocamos una puerta, tocamos un objeto, luego nos llevamos la mano a los ojos, a la boca, comemos, saludamos (...) y de esta manera es como más se transmiten las enfermedades", dijo. El profesor resaltó la importancia de informarse con fuentes confiables: "Ponerse en contacto con el departamento de salud y tratar de saber si la información que está recibiendo es correcta".

Hasta la fecha no se dispone de vacuna ni de tratamiento específico para combatir la infección por este nuevo brote.

Para el especialista, los síntomas son muy similares a los de un resfriado común: tos, goteo nasal, fiebre, entre otros. Sin embargo, hay un indicio que podría revelar una situación más grave.

"Cuando una persona empieza con falta de aire y esta persona no es un conocido asmático o la persona no tiene este tipo de problemas, debe sospechar de que algo realmente está mal", explicó el médico.
