"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest."— Matthew 11:28

SHARE THE BURDEN

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). These words of our Savior seem to be in stark contrast to the previous chapter from the same Gospel, when we were told that if we do not take up our crosses, we are not worthy of Christ.

Connecting these two messages might help us on our faith journeys. Being a follower of Christ surely means that we must embrace the cross, in its mystery of both suffering and triumph. This is something that we need not do alone, for the burden is often too heavy for us to carry by ourselves. Who, then, do we turn to? We can turn to the Body of Christ—the community of disciples gathered for worship. When we find the burden too heavy, let us remember that we can share that burden with our Christian sisters and brothers, who can help bring us rest.

SAINT MARIA GORETTI

SAINT MARIA GORETTI (1890-1902) July 6

Does anything match a mother's pride in her children? First Communions, confirmations, graduations, weddings: how these delight a mother's heart! Imagine, then, Assunta Goretti, the only mother ever to attend her child's canonization! In poverty-stricken rural Italy, widowed Assunta tended fields for the Serenelli family, whose eighteen-year-old son, Alessandro, propositioned her barely twelve-year-old Maria; then, when she resisted, crying, "It is a sin! God forbids it!" he stabbed her fourteen times.

As she lay dying, Maria assured the attending priest, "Yes, I forgive Alessandro! I want him to be in Paradise with me someday." Imprisoned, unrepentant, Alessandro changed after dreaming that a radiant Maria had offered him fourteen lilies. "I've kept my promise," she smiled. "You'll be here with me someday." Upon release, he rushed to beg Assunta's forgiveness. "Jesus has forgiven you," she replied, "my Maria, too. How can I refuse?" Next morning, mother and murderer walked arm in arm to church and knelt side by side for Communion.

GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO CHURCH SERVICES

A. GENERAL PRINCIPLES

1. The decree issued by Bishop Soto on March 13, 2020, dispensing ALL the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation remains in effect, including the instructions provided in the decree. Provide guidance to the faithful on how to continue observing the third commandment, Keep Holy the Lord's Day.

2. Those who fall in the vulnerable category, i.e. individuals age 65+ and persons with compromised health conditions, are asked to continue with the shelter-in-place ordinances instituted by state and local authorities.

3. Physical distancing is to be observed during the celebration of Mass by every person present. Individuals living in the same household may remain close to one another but must observe social distancing with other individuals or other households. All ministers (priests, deacons, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, lectors, altar servers, cantors, ministers of hospitality, etc.) are expected to practice social distancing at each Mass. The usual and common socialization before and after Masses must be conducted in accord with the restrictions currently in place.

4. A person who has a respiratory infection and may be exhibiting symptoms associated with the COVID-19 virus or otherwise is asked to refrain from coming to Mass. The same instruction applies particularly for priests, deacons and other ministers.

5. Sufficient means to disinfect or sanitize the location of the Mass must be available at each Mass. Every person in the celebration of the Mass must be able to sanitize themselves as often as it is required and whenever necessary before, during, and after the Mass. The Church, hall, or other venues appropriate to celebrate the Mass must adhere to and be able to accommodate the safety recommendations provided by civil authorities, e.g. social distancing, proper ventilation, and proper entrance/exit doors.

6. The communicants are to continue wearing the mask during the distributions of Holy Communion. Upon receiving communion they are to step to one side and consume the Body of Christ.

In the comments and feedback from several county health officials, they have strongly advised the suspension of the reception of communion on the tongue. Their advise is based upon more recent studies on the transmission of the COVID-19 virus..

Handwashing

Proper handwashing is the "gold standard" to removing and killing germs on our hands. Any soap that lathers works in killing and removing germs.

When washing your hands use warm water as it removes germs better than cold water. Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds, as it's the rubbing of your hands together that removes the germs. Additionally remember to dry your hands completely. If your hands are still wet you will pick up and transmit germs very easily.

Video Conference Meeting—June 1, 2020

Fr. Joyle led the opening “Prayer Against COVID 19” Minutes were read and approved.

New Business:

White Elephant Sale, usually held the first week-end in August will be cancelled this year, due to the dangers of COVID 19. both to helpers and visitors also.

Parish Fall Festival will also be cancelled this year, again due to current conditions with COVID 19 and the banning of large groups of people assembling,

Steps were discussed about the preparation of the Church for the resumption of Masses, both daily and weekly. Services to be held in the Church not the chapel to allow for distancing of participants. Glory and Praise books are not to be used, and the pews and floors will be marked for adequate spacing Masks will also be worn.

The church is to be cleaned after each Mass, also the Rest Rooms are to be cleaned after each Mass. Total number of parishioners allowed in the church is to be 100 with the overflow going to the parish hall.

Ministers are assigned to show parishioners to the pews and to escort them out after the service. All are encouraged not to gather outside, but to get in their cars and leave after Mass.

The number of Ministers is also to be restricted. Only one lector, and no choir—only one cantor and one musician, and one altar server for each Mass.

Collection boxes will not be distributed, they will be placed at the entrance and exit doors of the church.

Livestreaming will continue as long as restrictions are in place for the vulnerable and parishioners over 65. The 4:00pm English Mass and the 1:00pm Spanish Mass will be livestreamed.

Temporarily the 7:30m Mass will be moved to 7:00am to allow time to clean the church before the start of the 9:00am Mass.

Attendance for services will be on a first come first served basis.

Meeting concluded with a closing prayer.

COMPARTE LA CARGA

SANTA MARIA GORETTI

SANTA MARÍA GORETTI (1890-1902)
6 de julio

María Goretti nació en Italia, cerca de Roma, en una familia campesina muy pobre y debido a ello se vieron obligados a vivir en un rancho y compartir la casa con la familia Serenelli. Dos años después sufrió la muerte de su padre, situación que obligó a la madre a asumir las labores del campo para mantener a la familia y, a María, la forzó a renunciar a la escuela para hacerse cargo del hogar y del cuidado de sus hermanitos; aun así, se daba tiempo para asistir al catecismo.

A los 12 años María era una mujer bella y bien formada, fue precisamente esto lo que atrajo a Alejandro Serenelli, de 18 años, a proponerle que tuvieran relaciones sexuales, pero María se negó una y otra vez porque eso iba contra la voluntad de Dios. Cierta día llegó Alejandro a casa y al saber que María estaba sola quiso forzarla, pero María se opuso y, lleno de rabia, la apuñaló 14 veces. María murió al día siguiente, perdonándolo. Fue canonizada en 1950, estando presente su madre y sus hermanos.

5.- Y finalmente tenemos nuestro dedo más pequeño, el más pequeño de todos. Tu meñique debería recordarte que reces por ti mismo. Cuando haya terminado de orar, podrá ver sus propias necesidades, pero en la perspectiva adecuada, y también podrá orar por sus propias necesidades de una mejor manera.
