### SAINT KATERI TEKKWITH

#### SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA (1656-1680) July 14

Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs' Shrine, traffic's roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville—Ossernon to Native Americans—in the lovely Mohawk Valley, where Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions.

Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri's parents died in a smallpox epidemic widely blamed on the missionaries. Moreover, many Native Americans had experienced exploitation at the hands of "Christian" traders and trappers, further discrediting the faith Kateri embraced in baptism, then pledged to live even more intensely in vowed virginity.

Misunderstanding led to harassment, prompting her move to a Christian village farther north along the Saint Lawrence River. Despite this, Kateri's faith remained undaunted, her selfless charity undiminished. Both before and after her death at twenty-four, this young "Lily of the Mohawks" drew countless converts to Christ by the fragrance of her goodness. Through us, does "the aroma of Christ" (2 Corinthians 2:15), attract others to the beauty of his gospel?

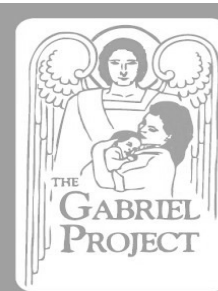

## GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING TO CHURCH SERVICES

### A. GENERAL PRINCIPLES

1. The decree issued by Bishop Soto on March 13, 2020, dispensing ALL the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation remains in effect, including the instructions provided in the decree. Provide guidance to the faithful on how to continue observing the third commandment, Keep Holy the Lord's Day.

2. Those who fall in the vulnerable category, i.e. individuals age 65+ and persons with compromised health conditions, are asked to continue with the shelter-in-place ordinances instituted by state and local authorities.

3. Physical distancing is to be observed during the celebration of Mass by every person present. Individuals living in the same household may remain close to one another but must observe social distancing with other individuals or other households. All ministers (priests, deacons, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, lectors, altar servers, cantors, ministers of hospitality, etc.) are expected to practice social distancing at each Mass. The usual and common socialization before and after Masses must be conducted in accord with the restrictions currently in place.

4. A person who has a respiratory infection and may be exhibiting symptoms associated with the COVID-19 virus or otherwise is asked to refrain from coming to Mass. The same instruction applies particularly for priests, deacons and other ministers.

5. Sufficient means to disinfect or sanitize the location of the Mass must be available at each Mass. Every person in the celebration of the Mass must be able to sanitize themselves as often as it is required and whenever necessary before, during, and after the Mass. The Church, hall, or other venues appropriate to celebrate the Mass must adhere to and be able to accommodate the safety recommendations provided by civil authorities, e.g. social distancing, proper ventilation, and proper entrance/exit doors.

6. The communicants are to continue wearing the mask during the distributions of Holy Communion. Upon receiving communion they are to step to one side and consume the Body of Christ.

In the comments and feedback from several county health officials, they have strongly advised the suspension of the reception of communion on the tongue. Their advise is based upon more recent studies on the transmission of the COVID-19 virus..

## PARISH COUNCIL & LITURGICAL COMMITTEE

Video Conference Meeting—June 1, 2020  
Fr. Joyle led the opening “Prayer Against COVID 19”  
Minutes were read and approved.

### New Business:

White Elephant Sale, usually held the first week-end in August will be cancelled this year, due to the dangers of COVID 19. both to helpers and visitors also.

Parish Fall Festival will also be cancelled this year, again due to current conditions with COVID 19 and the banning of large groups of people assembling,

Steps were discussed about the preparation of the Church for the resumption of Masses, both daily and weekly. Services to be held in the Church not the chapel to allow for distancing of participants. Glory and Praise books are not to be used, and the pews and floors will be marked for adequate spacing. Masks will also be worn.

The church is to be cleaned after each Mass, also the Rest Rooms are to be cleaned after each Mass. Total number of parishioners allowed in the church is to be 100 with the overflow going to the parish hall.

Ministers are assigned to show parishioners to the pews and to escort them out after the service. All are encouraged not to gather outside, but to get in their cars and leave after Mass.

The number of Ministers is also to be restricted. Only one lector, and no choir—only one cantor and one musician, and one altar server for each Mass.

Collection boxes will not be distributed, they will be placed at the entrance and exit doors of the church.

Livestreaming will continue as long as restrictions are in place for the vulnerable and parishioners over 65. The 4:00pm English Mass and the 1:00pm Spanish Mass will be livestreamed.

**Temporarily the 7:30m Mass will be moved to 7:00am to allow time to clean the church before the start of the 9:00am Mass.**

Attendance for services will be on a first come first served basis. Meeting concluded with a closing prayer.

SAN ENRIQUE

SAN ENRIQUE (972-1024)

13 de julio

Enrique nació en Alemania y desde pequeño fue educado por el obispo Wolfango, quien le ayudó a abrir su conciencia respecto a los pobres y a las necesidades de otros pueblos. Años después se casó con Cunegunda de Luxemburgo, pero debido a una enfermedad renal, nunca pudieron tener hijos. A los 34 años fue nombrado rey de Alemania y como tal fue ejemplar en el cuidado de los pobres y la lucha contra la opresión, así como la construcción y renovación de los monasterios en Alemania. Su caridad fue tan grande que su cuñado, molesto porque daba todo a los pobres, organizó un golpe militar, pero fue sometido por el rey, quien les perdonó la ofensa.

En el año 1014 fue coronado Emperador del Sacro Imperio Romano Germánico (Alemania, Austria, Suiza, Bélgica, Holanda y el Norte de Italia), pues tenía el cariño de la gente y la confianza del Papa. La gente apreciaba su santidad y el corazón de un gobernante que busca el bien de su pueblo. Fue canonizado en 1146 y su esposa, Santa Cunegunda, en 1200.

ORACIÓN DEL PAPA FRANCISCO CINCO DEDOS
