Rest assured we are here to announce the Mercy of God and our joy at following Him with humble hearts.

Next, Sunday, January 26th, we will be hosting an open house for our parish school. We provide an excellent education preparing children for a future full of hope in Jesus Christ. So, when was the last time you thought about the young people in your life and invited them to consider religious or ordained life in the Church? FR. CHRISTOPHER'S CONTEMPLATION

Hello and happy Sunday!

This week we celebrate the second week in ordinary time. I am always amazed at how fast time goes, especially the older you get. When I was a kid summer seemed to last forever and now it's over in a blink. It feels as though we were just starting Advent and now Christmas has come and gone and we find ourselves in the liturgical season of ordinary time.

We do not call it ordinary time because it is not special or is just plain or bland. Rather it is the time where we follow Jesus through His public ministry. Last week we celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This is the start of Jesus's public ministry. We do not hear much of Christ before His baptism except for the infant narratives (His birth, presentation and finding in the temple). Ordinary time leads us through the start of Christ's public ministry, the calling of the Apostles and the many miracles and healings He begins to work.

John this week in our Gospel points to Jesus, the one he baptized in the Jordan and says, "Behold, the lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. He is the one of whom I said, 'a man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.'" John points others to Jesus and proclaims to them who Christ is. He is the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. The lamb of God has been born to us. He has come to take away the sins of the world by calling us to His own baptism and now we are to follow the lamb of God. We continue the journey of faith with Christ.

As disciples of Christ who have been saved in the waters of baptism, let us take courage with John and follow in his example and proclaim to the world that the Lamb of God has come to free us from sin and draw us to Himself. Therefore as we continue this season of ordinary time let us take our psalm as our montra and pray it often: "Hear I am Lord, I come to do your will"

PRIESTLY VOCATIONS

This January 30 through February 2, men discerning a call to the priesthood have the chance to experience the seminary firsthand at a discernment weekend at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit.

Men who are high school seniors to age 55 will spend four days living at the seminary, focusing on the aspects of seminary life and the four pillars of formation (spiritual, human, intellectual and pastoral fellowship), which are the foundation of the seminary formation program. They will also spend time in fellowship and prayer.

Thanks to gifts to the Catholic Services Appeal, the archdiocesan Office of Priestly Vocations offers these up close and stress-free looks at seminary life several times a year. The next discernment weekend will be held March 19-22. A discernment overnight, for high school freshmen through juniors, will be held April 17-18.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Today, in his First Letter to the Corinthian community, St. Paul stresses the call to holiness through Christ. We must be aware that sanctity — to make holy — is not only for those we recognize as “saints.” In his Apostolic Exhortation, Rejoice and Be Glad, Pope Francis notes: We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and bearing witness in everything we do (paragraph 14). In St. John’s Gospel, John the Baptist sees Jesus passing by and proclaims: Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. Jesus is our perfect model of holiness. Do we, as Christian stewards, try to embrace Christ’s example through our call to holiness? Important steps toward sanctity include frequently participating in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, attending weekend quiet time for daily prayer and Scripture reading, and generously serving your family, parish, and neighbors in need.

SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

Next week, on the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, we will celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God for the first time. Last year Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of Word of God, “so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people” (*Misericordi et Misera*, 7). The Scriptures are treasures filled with countless riches! From Genesis to Revelation, God speaks to us in human language. By speaking to us, God reveals his part in this great love story: “God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him” (1 John 4:16).

In the Archdiocese of Detroit, we hear a lot about the power of the Word of God. We speak of the Gospel as something to be unleashed. We recognize that the Word of God has the potential to change hearts. When we proclaim the Word to others, they encounter the *power* of the Word and the *person* of the Word: Jesus Christ. But have you personally spent enough time hearing what Jesus is saying to you through the Word?

Pope Francis is asking everyone in the Church, every diocese, parish, family, and parishioner, to read and listen to the Word of God anew. In preparation for the celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God, consider your favorite Scripture passage. How has God used it to speak to you, change your heart, lead you, or bring you peace? Ask yourself how can I be open in these coming days to receive the gift of loving the Word of God more? How can I make my own these words from today’s psalm, “In the written scroll it is prescribed for me, to do your will, O my God, is my delight, and your law is within my heart” (Psalm 40:8-9)?

Jean's Jottings

I have to be honest, writing this article has been days in the making; my heart would not settle on any one message or thought. As I often do, I took these readings to prayer and reflection for inspiration but this time I ended up reflecting for days on end...then two main thoughts hit me so I offer them to you now for your reflection.

When John the Baptist saw Jesus, he knew Him because he saw the Holy Spirit within Him. I ask myself, 'can others see that I am a follower of Christ by how I conduct myself?' John the Baptist foretold and pointed to Jesus and His ministry; isn't that what our lives are to do? As baptized people of faith, are we not to witness and testify to Christ's mission? "*Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world*"...how do we show others forgiveness and the reconciling presence of Christ? The title, "Lamb of God" tells us about who Jesus is and His ministry. Think about His other titles and what those titles mean and identify in Jesus' ministry. What Jesus do you need in your life right now; The Divine Healer, the Prince of Peace, Abba Father?

The other sentence that would not let me go is from our first reading: "*Here am I, Lord, I come to do Your will.*" In short, do I? Do I stop and ask myself, 'is this God's will?' This phrase is a statement of faith and an identifier of who I am as a Catholic so do I really take it to heart? We are called to live our faith with hearts truly formed by God and His truths, therefore, our actions, decisions, and daily living should testify to that statement of faith. I have taken these thoughts very seriously and I have made a very concerted effort to make the necessary changes in my life to more truly reflect these postures of faith. Some days, I do far better than others but the key, I think, is that every day I remind myself who I am and Whom I stand in witness of.
