NEW HORIZONS
FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

During Lent this year each of our first readings speaks of the Covenants that God entered into with his people. This includes God's Covenants with Noah, Abraham and Moses. Last weekend our reading spoke of how the people were sent into exile when they broke the Covenant and this weekend Jeremiah speaks to the people about a new Covenant.

The word Covenant means bondedness, irrevocable relationship, and unbroken union. The covenants in the Old Testament are agreements between God and individuals or between God and Israel. Central to each Covenant is an agreement in which both parties are called to be faithful to the agreement.

Jeremiah was a prophet during some of the darkest days of Israel's history. Babylon was growing as an empire. Jeremiah felt that the only means of survival for the people was for them to repent of their sins and to seek God's mercy and forgiveness. The King of Babylon exiled the citizens of Judah to Babylon in both 598 BC and 587 BC. At a time of infidelity of God's people, Jeremiah looks to a future of hope. Jeremiah believes that one day God's people would be faithful. The prophet Jeremiah prophesied a new beginning between God and his people. The reason for this change is that the very inner nature of humanity will be created anew. Jeremiah believes that the people will not convert. Yahweh has to create a new people. A new heart is created in the people.

Both St. Paul and the author of Hebrews see Jesus as the fulfillment of this new Covenant. Every time we hear the Eucharistic Prayer prayed at Mass, we hear the quote from Jesus, "this is the new covenant in my blood." Each Eucharist commemorates and celebrates God's covenant relationship with fallen yet graced humanity.

The new Covenant to which Jesus refers begins in our baptism. This new covenant is God's final word and represents God's absolute salvation. Just as God's Holy People had to live out the Law in order to be faithful to the Covenant, so in baptism, we agree to renounce sin and evil and to believe in God. The conversion that we first celebrate at baptism is sacramentally renewed through the bread and cup of the Eucharist. The sacramental bond of this commitment begins at baptism and is deepened in Eucharist.

In the Gospel Jesus announces that his hour has finally come. Jesus does not pray that God save him from this hour but instead he accepts it, as he knows that this is why he was sent by the Father. In his humanity Jesus freely chose suffering.

Jesus taught his disciples, "whoever loves his life loses it." For the gain and power of this world can entrap and distract us from the weight of discipleship.

Jesus says that just as a seed dies once it is planted and comes to new life so once he dies on the cross he will come to new life and bear much fruit. This teaching also means that unless we die to ourselves, we will not be able bear fruit for God. In the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus put his life in God's hands and trusted God. He died to himself and accepted death and only then was able to bear fruit for God through the resurrection. We also must let go of our lives and let God do with them whatever he wishes.

Let us be a people who constantly submit to God's will. May we be willing to make those difficult decisions which will allow us to die to ourselves and live the lives to which God calls us.

HOLY WEEK

For the Palm Sunday Gospel, we return to the Gospel according to Mark. The account of the Passion takes up nearly one-third of Mark's entire Gospel and, of all the evangelists, he is the one who presents the details most graphically. He depicts the humanity of Jesus most intensely, describing his sufferings thoroughly. Mark portrays Jesus as a complete fulfillment of the "Suffering Servant" of Isaiah, the obedient, humble slave dying on a cross of whom Paul speaks in Philippians. But it is important to remember that we call this "Holy Week" and not "sad week" or "suffering week," for each of the readings today, even the lamentations of the psalm, end in the promise of the strength and hope that is granted by God to those who faithfully give of themselves in love. As we enter into this week through these readings, we must reflect deeply on the sufferings of Jesus, but still be confident in the joy of risen, eternal life that awaits all of us who faithfully walk with him through these days.

FEAST OF FAITH

The Liturgies of Holy Week

Holy Week is the culmination of the liturgical year. During these holy days, the liturgy will lead us, with Jesus, to the depths and to the heights.

It begins with a harsh juxtaposition, as we carry palms in remembrance of Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem and then listen to the Passion according to Matthew, as the King is handed over for crucifixion. Then, on Holy Thursday, we remember the night Jesus was handed over—the night he gave himself for us and to us, to live in our midst forever in the sacrament of his Body and Blood. On Good Friday, we touch with our hands the mystery of the Lord's cross, the instrument of torture that has become the tree of life. Then, at the great Easter Vigil, the lighting of the paschal candle speaks to us of the triumph of light over darkness, of life over death. The resurrection of the Lord becomes a living reality in our midst as the catechumens for whom the Church has prayed throughout Lent are plunged into the mystery of Christ's death and share in the glory of his resurrection. These are indeed holy days, the culmination of the Church's liturgy, and an invitation to participate in the very life of Christ. Come, let us worship.
