**NEW HORIZONS**  
**PENTECOST: THE RECEPTION OF THE HOLY SPIRIT**  
**May 23, 2021**

Almost 90 days ago we began the Season of Lent. Lent was a time of turning away from sin and toward God and a time of reflecting on the meaning of our baptism. Lent ended with the celebration of the *Triduum* on Holy Thursday evening. This sacred time allowed us to anticipate the upcoming celebration of Easter. At the Easter Vigil we began our celebration of the Resurrection and celebrated Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion. This was a glorious celebration. Please keep Tela and Todd in your prayers.

We continued to unpack the meaning of the Resurrection on Easter Sunday morning and this reflection has continued throughout the Season of Easter. Throughout the Easter Season we have reflected on not only the Resurrection but the new life that we have received through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. Pentecost is the celebration of the sending of the Holy Spirit. This event which closes the Season of Easter is also the last event in the Paschal Mystery – the Suffering, Death, Resurrection, Ascension and Sending of the Spirit. They are the central mysteries of our salvation.

Pentecost is often called the Birthday of the Church because after the Apostles receive the Holy Spirit, they go out boldly and bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth. It is the celebration which marks the beginning of the ministry and life of the Church. We who have received the gift of the Holy Spirit through our Baptism and Confirmation are called to proclaim that same Good News through our lives.

In his article “The Message of Pentecost” Karl Rahner writes that Pentecost shows that “God is ours.” Pentecost celebrates that God has given us his whole being without reserve through his gift of the Holy Spirit. Pentecost shows that God loves us and has blessed us with himself. Thus, we are to not lose sight of just how blessed we are as a result of this gift. We first receive the Holy Spirit in Baptism. In order to remain in the Holy Spirit, we must be a people of conversion. Conversion means turning away from sin and back to God every day. The Holy Spirit is always with us, even in times of darkness and pain when we do not feel the Spirit’s presence. The Holy Spirit is God’s gift of love that cannot be earned nor controlled.

The readings that we will hear this weekend first show that the Holy Spirit transforms and recreates our interior lives. The Gospel writer John writes that the Holy Spirit reminds us of the words of Jesus and leads us to all truth. So, we are to listen to the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit not only works in our interior lives but also blesses us with spiritual gifts so that we can better share our faith with others. In addition, the Holy Spirit gave the Apostles a sense of boldness which allowed them to move beyond their fear and share the Good News of Jesus Christ.

How do we open ourselves both to hear the guidance of the Holy Spirit and to live out the gifts of the Holy Spirit? First, we are to be a people of prayer and reflection who listen to the Spirit within. Second, we are to live lives of holiness which allow the Holy Spirit to work through us.

The presence of the Holy Spirit helped the disciples to share their faith and to form the new Christian community. As we look ahead to the future of our parish let us reflect on how each of us will use our spiritual gifts to build up our community. This may come through youth ministry, RCIA, Small Faith Communities, social events, Parish School of Religion, visiting the sick, etc. May we open ourselves to the life of the Spirit within us. May we allow ourselves to become the living stones with which God will build up our parish.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Bishop has updated his directives concerning the COVID 19 pandemic in order to keep each of our parishes safe.

Masks are no longer required but are still recommended during Mass.

The ministers of Holy Communion will only sanitize their hands prior to the distribution of Holy Communion, even with reception on the tongue.

Parishes may not have receptions.

Bishop Malone has indicated the dispensation concerning Mass attendance will end on the Feast of Corpus Christi which will be held on Saturday, June 12, 2021. Thus beginning on Corpus Christi, Catholics are obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and on Holy Days of Obligation. For a serious reason, such as being sick and caring for an infant, individuals can still be dispensed of their obligation to attend Mass. I ask that those who are sick are careful to not attend Mass during the pandemic.

I would like to remind the parishioners of St. Mary of the Pines and Sacred Heart that on June 20 you may receive the first dose of the Pfizer vaccine at St. Mary of the Pines and on July 11 you may receive the second dose at St. Mary of the Pines. The LSU Health Science Center is giving the Pfizer Vaccine on those days. To register for the vaccine please go to the following link <https://www.lsuhs.edu/>. Distribution of vaccines will be given from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm on those Sundays. Sacred Heart will be distributing the vaccine also as soon as the dates are decided.

May God keep each of you safe as we move beyond the pandemic.

**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

The roots of today's "birthday of the Church" are in an ancient Jewish festival of springtime harvest, seven weeks after Passover. Now, seven weeks after Easter, our great fifty days of rejoicing come to an end. In the countries where the Church first came to life, this is a time of harvest, and the first fruits appear: apricots and lemons, cherries and strawberries. Even in our gardens, herbs are abundant and asparagus, that close relation of the Easter lily, comes fresh to our tables. The earth is laden with so much new life, and that has always been a sign to Christians of Easter's glory.

Pentecost means "fifty" and our fifty days of Easter joy are complete. This Sunday is a day to savor the glory of Easter once more: picnics and cookouts, walks by the water, time in the garden—are all ways of extending the feast. Notice the paschal candle today, still burning during Mass. Our Easter celebration now complete, the candle will soon be moved to a place near the baptismal font, and be lighted at baptisms and funerals as a silent witness to Christ's abiding presence.

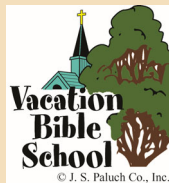
