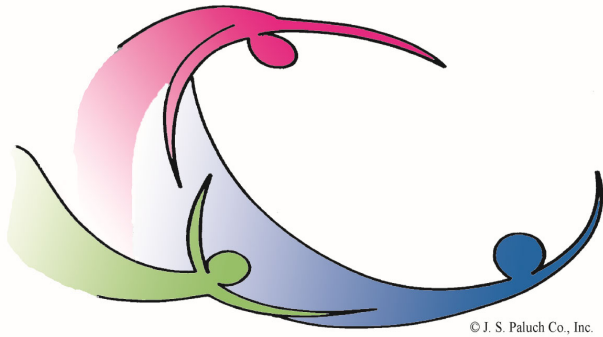

NEW HORIZONS
The Sacrament of Baptism – Article 1
June 27, 2021

While on vacation I have decided to write two articles which will help our parishes better understand the Sacrament of Baptism. On Wednesday, January 8, 2014 the Pope began a series of presentations on the Sacraments. His first two presentations focused on Baptism and so this article will draw from those two presentations. The Pope begins his first presentation by stating that “Baptism is the Sacrament on which our very faith is founded and which grafts us as a living member onto Christ and his Church. Together with the Eucharist and Confirmation it forms what is known as ‘Christian Initiation’, like one great sacramental event that configures us to the Lord and turns us into a living sign of his presence and of his love.”

The Pope next asks a question “is Baptism really necessary to live as a Christian and follow Jesus?” He asks isn’t Baptism merely a ritual, a formal act of the Church to give a child a name. To answer his own question the Pope quotes the second reading of the Mass for All Saints Day from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans, “Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life” (Romans 6:3-4). He then states that a person who is baptized is different than a person who is not baptized. “We, by Baptism, are immersed in that inexhaustible source of life which is the death of Jesus, the greatest act of love in all of history; and thanks to this love we can live a new life, no longer at the mercy of evil, of sin and of death, but in communion with God and with our brothers and sisters.”

The Pope then asked the people in St. Peter’s Square how many of them remembered the date of their Baptism. He stated that it is important to know when one was immersed into the current of Jesus’ salvation. The Pope invited the people to go home and find the date of their Baptisms so that they could reawaken the memory of their Baptism. The Pope reminded the people that they are to live out the hope of their Baptism each day. About Baptism he stated, “Thanks to Baptism, we are capable of forgiving and of loving even those who offend us and do evil to us. By our Baptism, we recognize in the least and in the poor the face of the Lord who visits us and makes himself close.”

The final point of the Pope during this first presentation on Baptism was that no one can baptize him or herself. We always need someone else to baptize us. Throughout history there is an ongoing chain of Baptisms which keeps the faith alive. In Baptism we experience the Church as a mother who gives birth to new children in Christ through the Holy Spirit.

May we give thanks to God for the gift of Baptism through which we enter the saving death and resurrection of our Lord and through which we become members of his Holy People. May we live out the holiness to which we are called in our Baptism

JESUS' EXAMPLE OF HELPING OTHERS

In today's second reading Paul offers a wonderful argument to his converts at Corinth for seeking to help those in need. He is dealing with a practical problem, arranging a collection for the poor of the church of Jerusalem; but as he often does, he develops an important teaching about Jesus to make his point.

After asking that they show their faith by generous gifts, he reminds them of the "gracious act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, for your sake he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich" (2 Corinthians 8:9). In the Incarnation our Lord assumed our human nature, certainly becoming poor for one who is God. The ultimate gracious act of this poverty was going to the cross with all its terrible sufferings. By this act of poverty we definitely become rich. Now our sins can be forgiven; we can share in the very life of God through the sacraments; we can attain eternal salvation!

Sacred Heart of Jesus Church will change its Wednesday morning Mass time to 9:00 am on July 7.

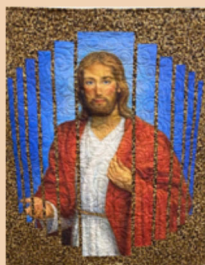
During the week St. Mary of the Pines will add a Mass on Monday morning at 8:30 am and on Wednesday morning at 8:30 am.

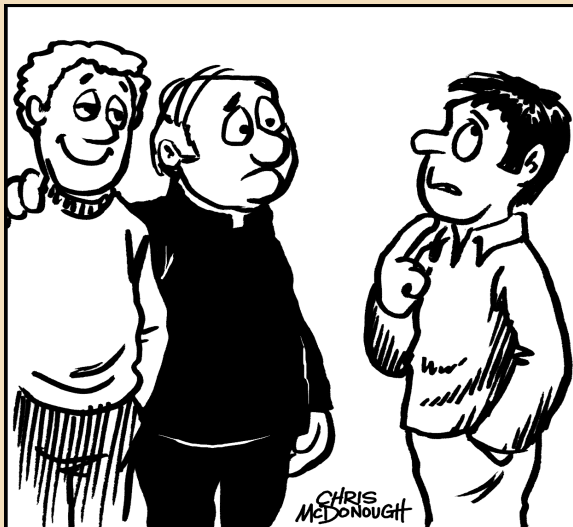
June 27 — Thirteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time
