The **Most Reverend Gary Michael Gordon** was born on June 10, 1957 in Vancouver, BC. He attended Christ the King Seminary in Mission, BC; Resurrection College in Waterloo, ON; and St. Peter’s Seminary in London, ON, where he graduated in 1982. Bishop Gary was ordained to the priesthood on May 22, 1982, by Archbishop James Carney at his home parish, St. Francis de Sales, Burnaby. On January 5, 2006, he was appointed by His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI as Bishop of the Diocese of Whitehorse; an event described by Bishop Gary as “hearing a call from God to go to the great white north,” which he happily followed. He was ordained and installed as the 5th Bishop of Whitehorse on March 22, 2006. On June 14, 2014, Pope Francis appointed Most Reverend Gary Gordon as the 17th Bishop of Victoria. Bishop Gordon succeeds the Most Reverend Richard Gagnon who was appointed Archbishop of Winnipeg on October 28, 2013.



Rev. Alan Campeau was born in Windsor, ON in 1959 and grew up in the town of Belle River. At the age of 23, he entered St. Peter’s Seminary, London and was ordained in 1990. Reflecting on the shortage of priests, Fr. Al volunteered to move to the Diocese of Thunder Bay (as a priest on loan) in 1995. He is currently the Pastor of three parishes stretching 150km along the Trans Canada Highway. On the Diocesan scene, he has served on the Presbyteral Council, Stewardship Committee, Youth Advisory Board, and Coordinator for Priests Retreats. Fr. Al became the Diocesan representative for the CFPC in 2007 and then was elected as Vice-President for the Central Region completing his term in 2012. Fr. Al played a key role in revising the “Enhancing Your Ministry Kit” published in 2014.
