Reflection Corner

I sometimes say to couples when I celebrate their wedding Mass that they bring weaknesses and hurts with them to their married life and they are called to heal each others' wounds during their married life. They are to bring the love of Jesus to each other and help each other to grow to become whom God has called each of them to be. In the same way we may bring with us to seminary wounds, weaknesses and hurts. And we too are called to allow the Lord to work in our lives transforming us so that we become whom he has called us to be. In the Gospel today when Jesus had finished praying he said, "Lazarus, come out!" Jesus says to each of us also, "Come out of your tomb, come out your bondage. Do not live in the darkness, live in the light. Do not live in fear, live in faith." When Lazarus came out of the tomb, Jesus then said, "Unbind him, let him go free." Jesus also says to each of us, "Be unbound and go free. Live with my life."

Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead physically in his body. He had been dead for four days. Jesus had previously raised the daughter of Jairus and the son of the widow of Nain. But nowhere is there an instance of someone being raised from the dead after four days. This is the crowning miracle of Jesus' ministry. In fact in John's Gospel it becomes the main reason leading to Jesus' death. If Jesus can restore a body that had been in the tomb for four days and has begun to decompose he can certainly mend the brokenness and wounds of our lives.

Jesus can mend all the brokenness and wounds of your life. Do you believe that Jesus not only offer you resurrection in the future but also the fullness of life now in the present?" Jesus proclaims that he is both the *resurrection* and the *life*. He promises future resurrection but also invites us to share *now* in the *fullness of his life*. The resurrection of Lazarus is not just a promise about the future of each of us. It is also an invitation from Jesus to enter into the fullness of his life in the present, right now, and that life will continue in us after death. Notice that when Jesus received the mes-



sage about Lazarus' illness he stayed where he was for two more days. We expect God to answer prayer in our time but sometimes God's time is different to ours. Also sometimes we may be tempted to despair and say God cannot do anything for me. Jesus is constantly calling us to new life in him; to come forth from whatever is keeping us in bondage. Sometimes a hurt we thought had been healed in prayer may surface again months or years later. This is a grace from God, God is now inviting us to a deeper healing of that situation. You must spend time in prayer and inviting the Lord into every aspect of your life and then answering his call to come out of the tomb.

Note From Archbishop Gomez:

Due to the COVID-19 (novel coronavirus) pandemic, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles made the unprecedented decision to suspend the celebration of Holy Mass to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 (novel coronavirus). In order to continue to bring the celebration of the Eucharist, an integral part of the Catholic faith, Masses celebrated privately by Archbishop José H. Gomez and the priests at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels, as well as Masses at other parishes of the Archdiocese, are being offered via livestream for the faithful.

Through a partnership with Univision Los Angeles, the Masses in Spanish from the Cathedral are now being brought directly into homes over the air via Univision's local UniMas KFTR-TV, Channel 46, Monday-Friday and Sunday at 7 a.m., especially serving those who do not have internet or cable access. Catholic media are also helping to bring Holy Mass directly to Catholic faithful airing Masses in English and Spanish on cable, radio and via the internet on El Sembrador (ESNE) TV/ Radio, Guadalupe Radio, Relevant Radio and The Catholic Channel on SiriusXM.

"Being able to bring the celebration of the Eucharist and the Word of God directly to our community of faith is a great blessing," explained Archbishop José H. Gomez. "Our Catholic community is doing our part to limit the spread of this global public health threat by suspending Masses at all parishes for the first time in the history of our Archdiocese. Even though we cannot publicly gather in communion to celebrate our faith together during these difficult times, I encourage our faithful to continue to participate in the Holy Mass via television, radio and online so that we may continue to pray together for the Lord's grace and mercy in our time of need."

Mensaje para Reflexionar

En las lecturas que escucharemos este domingo encontramos una promesa de salvación por parte de Dios en favor del pueblo de Israel, y se nos narra la resurrección de Lazaro, descubrimos los inicios del cumplimiento de esa promesa en favor no solo del pueblo de Israel sino de toda la humanidad, nos dice Jesús: “Yo soy la resurrección y la vida: el cree en mí, aunque haya muerto, vivirá; y el que esta vivo y cree en mí, no morirá para siempre” (Jn 11,25-26). Pero, para que esa promesa de salvación de Dios se realice en nuestro tiempo, en mi vida, en la vida de mi familia, de mi comunidad, de la Iglesia y de toda la humanidad, Dios necesita de nuestra colaboración, eso lo ha dicho uno de los santos mas grandes de nuestra Iglesia, San Agustín: “Dios que te creo sin ti, necesita de ti, para salvarte”. Por el pecado nos alejamos con mucha facilidad de los caminos de Dios, y a veces, creemos que el regreso hacia él se nos hará fácil pero, no es de todo cierto; lo que es cierto es, que Dios nos esta esperando siempre con los brazos abiertos para perdonarnos, pero que vamos a manteneros en sus caminos sin tener que luchar todos los días, o que no vamos ha sufrir si nos apartamos de él, es totalmente falso.

San Pablo nos advierte en este domingo que “los que están en la carne no pueden agrandar a Dios” (Rm 8,8). Con la palabra carne, San Pablo se refiere a todo aquello que conduce a la persona a vivir en el pecado, y por lo tanto, ha ofender a Dios. Y fue precisamente esta desobediencia del pueblo de Israel para con Dios, lo que llevó a que él permitiera que Nabucodonosor, rey de Babilonia, subiera a Jerusalén, invadiera la ciudad, saqueara el templo, y “deportara a todo Jerusalén, todos los jefes y los notables, diez mil deportados” (2 Rey 24, 14). Y toda esta gente tuvo que sufrir muchísimo por un largo tiempo pero, después de todo, cuando Dios vio que el sufrimiento los había hecho comprender la maldad de su pecado, él mismo envió al profeta Ezequiel para que infundiera fe y esperanzas en su pueblo, diciéndoles de parte suya: “Yo mismo abriré vuestros sepulcros, y os haré salir de vuestros sepulcros, pueblo mío, y os traeré a la tierra de Israel” (Ez 37,12). Alejarse de Dios y no entender de ninguna manera la gravedad de nuestros pecados tiene sus consecuencias graves en la vida.

El evangelio de San Juan nos dice que: “Dios ha enviado su Hijo al mundo no para juzgarnos sino para salvarnos” (Jn 3,17), para sacarnos de cualquier sepulcro en el que podamos haber caído por nuestros pecados, y eso es lo que Jesús nos enseña al resucitar a su amigo Lázaro.

Hermanas y hermanos, ¿Cómo esta viviendo usted estos días de Cuaresma? ¿Esta logrando descubrir el inmenso amor que Dios le tiene? ¿Se esta dando cuenta de que es necesario que usted colabore con el Señor, renunciando al pecado, para que la salvación de Dios se realice en su propia vida?
