St. John Neumann Catholic School Virtual Learning Agreement

We know this is not an easy decision nor will it be an easy way of learning. We want to be sure that all parents, students, and teachers are on the same page with what will be expected of those students learning from home. This will be a learning process for all of us, using the insights gained from the Spring, training teachers received over the summer, and this new experience of having students joining our classrooms virtually. Below are expectations and responsibilities for families choosing virtual learning.

1. Parents must ensure that internet connectivity is available for their student(s).
 2. Each student is expected to have a dedicated device for their use. The school will provide devices to students, unless families notify us that they will use their own devices.
 3. Students/Parents will be responsible for logging into their session on time as assigned by the teacher. Attendance will be determined based upon being present virtually.
 4. Parents should still notify the school office if their child will be absent from online learning that day.
 5. Students will be responsible for completing and turning in work when assigned.
 6. Students/Parents are responsible for communicating with the teacher on a regular basis. This includes academic, procedural, or technology concerns.
 7. All classes will utilize Google Classroom for posting assignments.
 8. Each Friday will be designated as a day for parents to drop off any physical work from the week, while picking up physical work for the upcoming week.
 9. Students will be expected to be seated upright with video and audio on at all times in an area without distractions (to include food, pets, inappropriate background scenery, etc.) unless directed differently by the teacher. Turning either off without permission is the same as leaving class without permission
- *Failure to comply may be cause for disciplinary action or loss of virtual attendance privileges.

10. Students will be expected to be in school uniform at least from the waist up (tops).

*Failure to comply may be cause for blockage or removal from the streaming.

11. Students/Parents are responsible for their behavior while being online. Students should follow the same code of conduct expected in the school building. If a student is disruptive, they will be given a warning. If it continues, they will be removed from the session and the parent will be notified.

12. Teachers will be responsible for acknowledging the student to the best extent possible during the lesson. However, classroom behavior such as raised hand, waiting until the teacher is done speaking, etc. will be expected. Teachers will do their best to assist the child from home, but especially for younger grades, they may need adult assistance as well.

13. Assessments for those students online will vary by class and by teacher. Each teacher will contact you at the beginning of the school year to address and explain the various methods of assessment that will be used.

14. Teachers of specials classes will be in communication with families about activities and assignments. Physical Education will not host virtual participation.

14. If there is a substitute teacher in a classroom for a day or two, the class will not be live streamed but work will be provided. If a teacher is out for any extended length of time, we will continue live streaming.

15. It is expected that students will be present for all classes during the day unless the teacher tells them otherwise. (For example, the student or teacher may log off or shut down the camera/voice during bathroom breaks, lunch, recess, etc.)

16. PreK will only stream during the morning academic sessions.

Please know that teaching in front of a classroom while also attending to students online will be new for all of us, but our goal is to keep the instruction, communication, and community connected as much as we possibly can. Please be patient with us as we continue working and learning simultaneously.
