Angel of God, My Guardian Dear

This is a big week for memorial celebrations of the saints. Perhaps the most meaningful to us is that of St. Therese of the Child Jesus who is not only an inspirational saint but also the patron of our diocese.

On Tuesday, we remember the three archangels specifically mentioned in the Bible by name: Michael, Gabriel and Raphael.

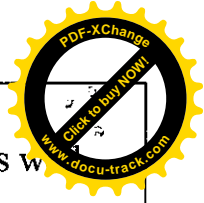
Michael's name means "who can compare to God" and he is the manifestation of God's power and might. He is the one who fights Satan. *St. Michael.... defend us against the wickedness and snares of the devil. (Pope Leo XIII, 1886)*

Gabriel's name means "God is my strength". He is the Angel of God's dignity and also the angel of the Annunciation. *The angel said, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." Luke 1:30.*

Raphael's name means "God is my health". He is the angel who moved the waters in the pool when Jesus worked a miracle in *John 5:1-4*. He is also chief of the guardian angels.

Which leads us to the memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels which is celebrated on Friday. This is one of the great consolations of our relationship with God. He cares so much for us that he gives each of us an angel to serve as a protector and a guide throughout our life. Our guardian angels may occasionally get grey hairs while watching over some of us but thank God they are there.
