Taking a Step Forward

Last Wednesday, we celebrated the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. October is designated the month of the rosary. It is a prayer from our childhood and a wonderful way to honor our Blessed Mother. It is through the rosary that she helps us to grow closer to her Son because as we pray each Hail Mary, we can meditate on the events of Christ's life.

The Rosary is called the "Psalter of Mary" because all fifteen of the "original" mysteries, with their 150 Hail Mary's, corresponds to the number of psalms. Praying all fifteen of the decades at once is known as the Dominican Rosary.

In 2002, Pope John Paul II updated the Rosary with the Luminous Mysteries. These mysteries or the Mysteries of Light, as they are called, focus on the public life of Jesus, the time he was preaching spanning the time between His Baptism and His death. The Luminous Mysteries are as follows:

- The Baptism of Jesus
- Jesus' first miracle at Cana.
- Jesus proclaiming the Kingdom of God.
- The Transfiguration.
- The institution of the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper.

To quote our Holy Father, Pope Francis, each time we pray the rosary, "we are taking a step forward, towards the great destination of life"—heaven.
