Autumn's Summers

Except for that little cold snap a couple of week ago (which brought much needed rain and a scurry to find one's sweaters), we have been enjoying the beautiful "fall" days which officially begins in two days with the autumnal equinox.

After that equinox, the calendar calls it fall but some days we say are still summer. Some may say "Indian summer" but the pilgrims didn't and the Farmer's Almanac didn't. It was Saint Augustine's summer when September was clear and balmy. Similarly, the golden sun, the robin's-egg-blue October days, usually after the first killing frost, were Saint Luke's summer. And the fair, warm days of early November were Saint Martin's summer. The *Farmer's Almanac* has long said, "If All Saints day brings out winter, Saint Martin's feast day brings out Indian summer." (The feast of Saint Augustine is August 28; Saint Luke, October 18; All Saints Day, November 1; and Saint Martin, November 11.)
