

Divine Mercy Sunday

Meditation Divine Mercy Sunday

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. God showers His mercy upon us so that we may be with Him in heaven when we leave this earth.

Perhaps the most often quoted definition of mercy is from Shakespeare's *The Merchant of Venice, Act IV, Scene 1*.

"The quality of mercy is not strained, It droppeth as the gentle rain from heaven Upon the place beneath. It is twice blest; It blesseth him that gives and him that takes."

The Octave, or eighth day, of Easter has always been considered special by Christians. Christ, after His Resurrection, revealed Himself to His disciples, but St. Thomas was not with them. He declared he would never believe that Christ had risen from the dead until he could see Him in the flesh and probe Christ's wounds with his hands. A week after His Resurrection, Christ once again appeared to His apostles and this time Thomas was there. Thomas immediately professed his belief.

Nineteen centuries later, Christ appeared to a Polish nun, Sr. Maria Faustina Kowalska, in a series of visions spanning eight days. He revealed the Divine Mercy novena and asked the nun to pray for nine days beginning on Good Friday and ending on the Saturday before the octave of Easter. Thus since novenas are commonly prayed before a feast, the Feast of Divine Mercy was born. *Thanks to ThoughtCo, 2019*
