Pentecost Sunday

“They were all filled with the Holy Spirit.” (Acts 2:4)

Before Jesus ascended into heaven, he told the apostles that they would be “baptized with the Holy Spirit” (Acts 1:5). So together with Mary, they “devoted themselves with one accord to prayer” (1:14). And sure enough, the Holy Spirit came—with wind and fire and with a new boldness to preach the gospel.

Pentecost tells a beautiful story about God’s power and the apostles’ transformation. But they didn’t receive the Spirit just that one day. They were immersed in the Spirit again and again. The Book of Acts records at least seven times that the apostles were “filled” with the Spirit (Acts 2:4; 4:8, 31; 6:8; 7:55; 13:9, 52). And this doesn’t count all the other times that never made it into the Bible!

The same is true for us. Although we received the Holy Spirit in Baptism, we too need more of the Spirit’s power and gifts to follow the Lord and proclaim the good news.

Jesus knew how much we would need the Holy Spirit, and so even long before his Ascension, he encouraged his disciples to pray for this gift: “If you . . . know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit?” (Luke 11:13). And John’s Gospel assures us that God “does not ration his gift of the Spirit” (3:34). There is always more that God has for us!

Today, follow the apostles’ example. Believe in God’s promise of the Spirit and then pray for it. Keep praying, not just on this special feast, but every day. You might even ask a few faith-filled friends to pray with you for a new outpouring of the Spirit in your life. You may not see wind or fire, but the Spirit will come to you in new, unexpected, and even extraordinary ways—not only for your benefit, but for the good of his body, the Church!

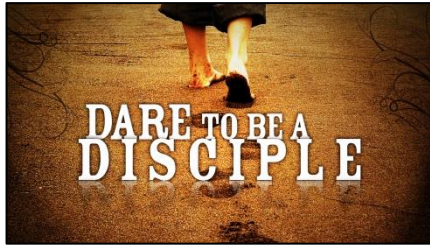

and proclaim his message to all people. Fifty days after the Passover, on the Jewish Feast of Pentecost, the Spirit filled them with wisdom and courage. They left the upper room to proclaim Jesus to all the world by what they said and did. They stood among people both familiar and foreign, some friendly and others fierce foes. They understood the challenge and the consequences. They took the risk of imitating Jesus and did not waiver in the face of opposition and dangers. We have been sent by Jesus. Can we do more?

FUNERALS

How do I make arrangements? You should try to reach the Pastor as soon as possible to "inform" him of the death. A funeral time "may" be agreed to by phone; however, the family must complete in person an information paper for the Church records at the Administration Office at the earliest convenient time. Never determine a funeral time without first having consulted the Pastor. It is important to inform the Pastor if the funeral is to have additional features (Military, K.C.'s, Ladies Altar Society, etc.). There are times when the Pastor is not at the office. Please inform Sandy Marie that your call is in reference to a death.



PERPETUAL CARE - FOR PEACE OF MIND

Perpetual Care is a service offered to you by the Office of Cemeteries of the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux.

- WHAT IS ELIGIBLE?

Tombs, slabs and vaults constructed of concrete, marble or granite are all potentially eligible for perpetual care.

- WHAT IS COVERED?

Cleaning of stone, re-grouting of stone joints, cleaning and/or painting of cement finishes when needed in judgment of cemetery, repairs to roof, and such other work that may be required to maintain the memorial in good condition; including also care and maintenance of aisles and roadways leading to the memorial.

- HOW DO I GET IT?

Contact the Cemetery Office where your family burial is located or the Diocesan Office of Cemeteries (446-0280) for your no-obligation, no-charge proposal.

Having a family burial location gives you peace of mind; having perpetual care relieves others of the burdens of maintenance.
