

Ave Maria Academy Reopening Health & Safety Plan (Revised 8/3/2020)

CDC Updates:

- If a School community member suspects or knows he/she had COVID-19, and had symptoms, he/she may return to School or attend a School activity, sport, or event after:
 - 10 days since symptoms first appeared; **and**
 - At least 24 hours with no fever without fever-reducing medication; **and**
 - Symptoms have improved.
 - Note: If you are tested to see if you still have COVID-19, you may return to School when:
 - You have no fever, **and**
 - Respiratory symptoms have improved, **and**
 - You receive two negative test results in a row, at least 24 hours apart.
- If a School community member tested positive for COVID-19 but had no symptoms, and continue to have no symptoms, that individual may return to school or attend a School activity, sport, or event after:
 - 10 days have passed since test, **or**
 - After he/she receives two negative test results in a row, at least 24 hours apart.
 - Note: The individual's doctor should work with an infectious disease expert at the local health department to determine if he/she is likely to spread COVID-19 to others and need to stay home longer.
- I understand that anyone who has close contact with someone with COVID-19 may not return to School or attend a School activity, sport, or event until:
 - 14 days after exposure.
- I understand that School community members who have a weakened immune system (immunocompromised) due to a health condition or medication may need to take additional precautions and/or stay home longer than 10 days in the event of infection. These individuals are encouraged to consult their healthcare provider and work with the School Principal to effectuate any necessary reasonable accommodations.
