MASS is celebrated each day (Monday-Saturday) at 10.00 am and in addition on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays there will also be an earlier Mass at 7.30 am.

TUESDAYS OF LENT

Every Tuesday evening during Lent there will be an opportunity to deepen our faith and strengthen the bonds of community. **Each session begins at 7.00 pm in the hall** and includes the opportunity for a cup of tea and a chat afterwards.

- **Tuesday 12th March** begins a Bishop Robert Barron big-screen DVD series entitled "**Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues**" in which Bishop Barron reflects on how the seven deadly sins keep us separated from God but can be counteracted by the 'lively virtues'. Video presentation followed by reflection with materials to take home
- **Tuesday 19th and 26th March** Bishop Barron's series continues
- **Tuesday 2nd April** "**Sharing the Journey**" through reflection and prayer of refugees and those marginalized.
- **Tuesday 9th April** Bishop Barron series concludes
- **Tuesday 16th April** (Holy Week) A video presentation through which Father Denis McBride gives a

reflection guiding us along the way of the cross using powerful images to open up new ways of praying about Jesus' journey.

GOSPEL

Luke 4:1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.' Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.' Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you, and again: They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.' But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.' Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the panner from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God.
