The Catholic Church will be represented by the Archdiocesan Justice & Peace Commission and the St Vincent de Paul Society at this event on Sunday, 30 June 2019 from 12:00-3:00pm in George Square. One Big Picnic is a free, open-air community meal for everyone. Now for the third year running, this volunteer-led, grass-roots community event aims to promote the unity and dignity of all the people of Glasgow by sharing quality food, conversation and fun. The food will be served up by volunteers from all faiths and none brought together through the Interfaith Food Justice Network. They come from diverse, local charitable groups who provide free, delicious food week

in week out to people experiencing homelessness and food poverty in Glasgow. There will be music and entertainment from diverse cultures - again all provided by volunteers. We believe that everyone - regardless of cultural and religious background, social or educational status, homelessness or wealth - should be able to enjoy quality food in dignity and feel part of One Big Community. We want to show that Glasgow is a city of caring people - that people really do make Glasgow!

GOSPEL

Luke 9:11-17

Jesus made the crowds welcome
and talked to them about the
kingdom of God; and he cured those
who were in need of healing. It
was late afternoon when the Twelve
came to him and said, 'Send the
people away, and they can go to the
villages and farms round about to
find lodging and food; for we are in a
lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give
them something to eat yourselves.'
But they said, 'We have no more
than five loaves and two fish, unless
we are to go ourselves and buy food
for all these people.' For there were
about five thousand men. But he said
to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down
in parties of about fifty.' They did so
and made them all sit down. Then he
took the five loaves and the two fish,
raised his eyes to heaven, and said
the blessing over them; then he
broke them and handed them to his
disciples to distribute among the
crowd. They all ate as much as they
wanted, and when the scraps
remaining were collected they filled
twelve baskets.
