Financial Matters

Once again, I would like to express my gratitude to all those who have been generous in supporting Saint Helen's during this difficult time. In keeping the

accounts up to date each week I have noticed that so many of you are making an on-going commitment to regular giving. This is so much appreciated. While our weekly income is still substantially less due to the fact that we are not able to gather for Sunday Mass, so also are our costs – there has been only minimal heating in the church these last few weeks and the Archdiocese has deferred all payments due for levy, etc. to allow parishes to protect their bank balances. Although last week we were forced to undertake some essential work on the roof and on the stonework since water was getting into the building and damaging the plaster. Hopefully we will be able to meet these unexpected expenses with your continued help. I have given the EXACT details of the parish bank account again below – new regulations mean that the longer form of our account name must be used, so be patient and persistent until you get the right combination!

First reading


Acts 2:1-11




