

## Church Reopening

We are delighted that the Church is permitted to open once again for personal prayer. In order to do so safely we will open very cautiously and gradually at first. This week the Church will be open for a visit on **MONDAY 22<sup>nd</sup>, THURSDAY 25<sup>th</sup> and SUNDAY 28<sup>th</sup> from 12 noon until 2.00 pm** on each of these days. I would like to record my deep gratitude for the incredible amount of work that was done this week to prepare the Church for reopening by a deep-clean of the whole building.

If you are visiting the church at these times it is essential that you comply with the following:

- Face Coverings must be worn at all times within the Church
- Hands must be sanitized with the sanitizer provided on entry and exit
- Volunteers will welcome you and direct you to an available place which will ensure social distancing from other visitors
- Please follow the instructions of the volunteers at all times.
- There is a one-way system in operation – please follow the floor markings
- You are asked to limit your visit to around 15 minutes

## Live-Stream important information

Until now we have used Facebook as the main platform for our daily live stream of Mass, devotions, etc. A camera has now been installed in the Church and, to correspond with our re-opening, from Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> June Mass will be celebrated from the Church rather than the oratory. (obviously at the moment still without the possibility of a congregation). The technicalities behind this change mean that our main platform will no longer

be Facebook but a direct live-feed to the parish web page ([www.sthelenslangside.org.uk](http://www.sthelenslangside.org.uk)). It is hoped that we will be able to relay the live feed back to Facebook for those who have become used to this means of viewing, but from Monday it would be safer to start using the web page rather than the Facebook Page. For those who catch up with Mass later, this live feed can be 'rewound' for up to 10-11 hours so that you can watch Mass later in the day.

Mass offerings can be put through the chapel house letterbox (165 Camphill Avenue) if it is safe and convenient to do so when you are on your permitted daily outing; otherwise they should be deferred until better times!

If you need a Mass card, please put a note through the letterbox (if it is safe for you to do so) being sure to give (1) the name of the deceased, (2) the name of the person requesting the Mass and (3) an address so that the Mass card can be posted. Mgr Paul will happily sign it and forward it on for you.
