

Re-Opening for Mass

Due to Government regulations, numbers at Mass are very limited and so entry will only be permitted to those who have successfully pre-booked a place. Volunteers will check the names as you enter the church.

We are using *Eventbrite* to manage our bookings. You will find a link to book a place at Mass at Saint Helen's [here](#) and on the parish website and Facebook page. Please follow the instructions to request a place at one of the available Masses.

1st/2nd August

Vigil (Sat) 5.30 pm, 9.00 and 11.00 am and 5.00 pm

Please read the following observations from what we have learned from our first week of booking:

IF YOU ARE SUCCESSFUL IN MAKING A BOOKING BUT SUBSEQUENTLY ARE UNABLE TO TAKE UP THE PLACE, PLEASE RETURN TO THE SYSTEM AND CANCEL YOUR BOOKING SO THAT THE SPACE IS AVAILABLE FOR SOMEONE ELSE. PLEASE AVOID PHONING OR EMAILING THE PARISH TO CANCEL A PLACE SINCE THIS IS VERY TIME CONSUMING AND NEGATES ONE OF THE BIG BENEFITS OF THE ELECTRONIC SYSTEM.

ALSO, IF YOU ARE BOOKING MORE THAN ONE PLACE, PLEASE ENSURE THAT EACH INDIVIDUAL NAME IS ENTERED – ITS FINE TO DUPLICATE THE CONTACT INFORMATION IF YOU ARE ALL IN THE ONE HOUSEHOLD, BUT YOU NEED TO MAKE SURE THAT EACH INDIVIDUAL NAME IS ENTERED (NOT JUST THE NAME OF THE FIRST REGISTRATION)

If you are unsuccessful in booking a place or if you are still a bit nervous about coming out to a public place, please remember that the bishops have dispensed the Sunday obligation indefinitely – **you are under no obligation to attend Sunday Mass**

Please also remember the following:

- **If you are shielding or have any symptoms, please do not consider booking a place.**
- **Face Coverings must be worn at all times within the Church** (even during Mass)
- **Hands must be sanitized** with the sanitizer provided on entry and exit
- Volunteers will welcome you and direct you to a **designated** place which will ensure social distancing from other visitors
- Please follow the instructions of the volunteers at all times.
- In order to minimize the length of time people are gathered, there have been some adjustments to the Liturgy
- No congregational singing is permitted.
- Holy Communion can be received but with a different system in place – this will be explained at Mass

Gospel

Matthew 13:24-43

Jesus put another parable before the
crowds: 'The kingdom of heaven may be
compared to a man who sowed good
seed in his field. While everybody was
asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel
among the wheat, and made off. When
the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the
darnel appeared as well. The owner's
servants went to him and said, "Sir, was
it not good seed that you sowed in your
field? If so, where does the darnel come
from?" "Some enemy has done this" he
answered. And the servants said, "Do
you want us to go and weed it out?" But

he said, "No, because when you weed
out the darnel you might pull up the
wheat with it. Let them both grow till the
harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to
the reapers: First collect the darnel and
tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather
the wheat into my barn.'" He put another
parable before them: 'The kingdom of
heaven is like a mustard seed which a
man took and sowed in his field. It is the
smallest of all the seeds, but when it has
grown it is the biggest shrub of all and
becomes a tree so that the birds of the
air come and shelter in its branches.' He
told them another parable: 'The kingdom
of heaven is like the yeast a woman took
and mixed in with three measures of flour
till it was leavened all through.' In all this
Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables;
indeed, he would never speak to them
except in parables. This was to fulfil the
prophecy: I will speak to you in parables
and expound things hidden since the
foundation of the world. Then, leaving the
crowds, he went to the house; and his
disciples came to him and said, 'Explain
the parable about the darnel in the field
to us.' He said in reply, 'The sower of the
good seed is the Son of Man. The field is
the world; the good seed is the subjects
of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects
of the evil one; the enemy who sowed
them, the devil; the harvest is the end of
the world; the reapers are the angels.
Well then, just as the darnel is gathered
up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at
the end of time. The Son of Man will send his
angels and they will gather out of his
kingdom all things that provoke offences
and all who do evil, and throw them into
the blazing furnace, where there will be
weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the
virtuous will shine like the sun in the
kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone
who has ears!'

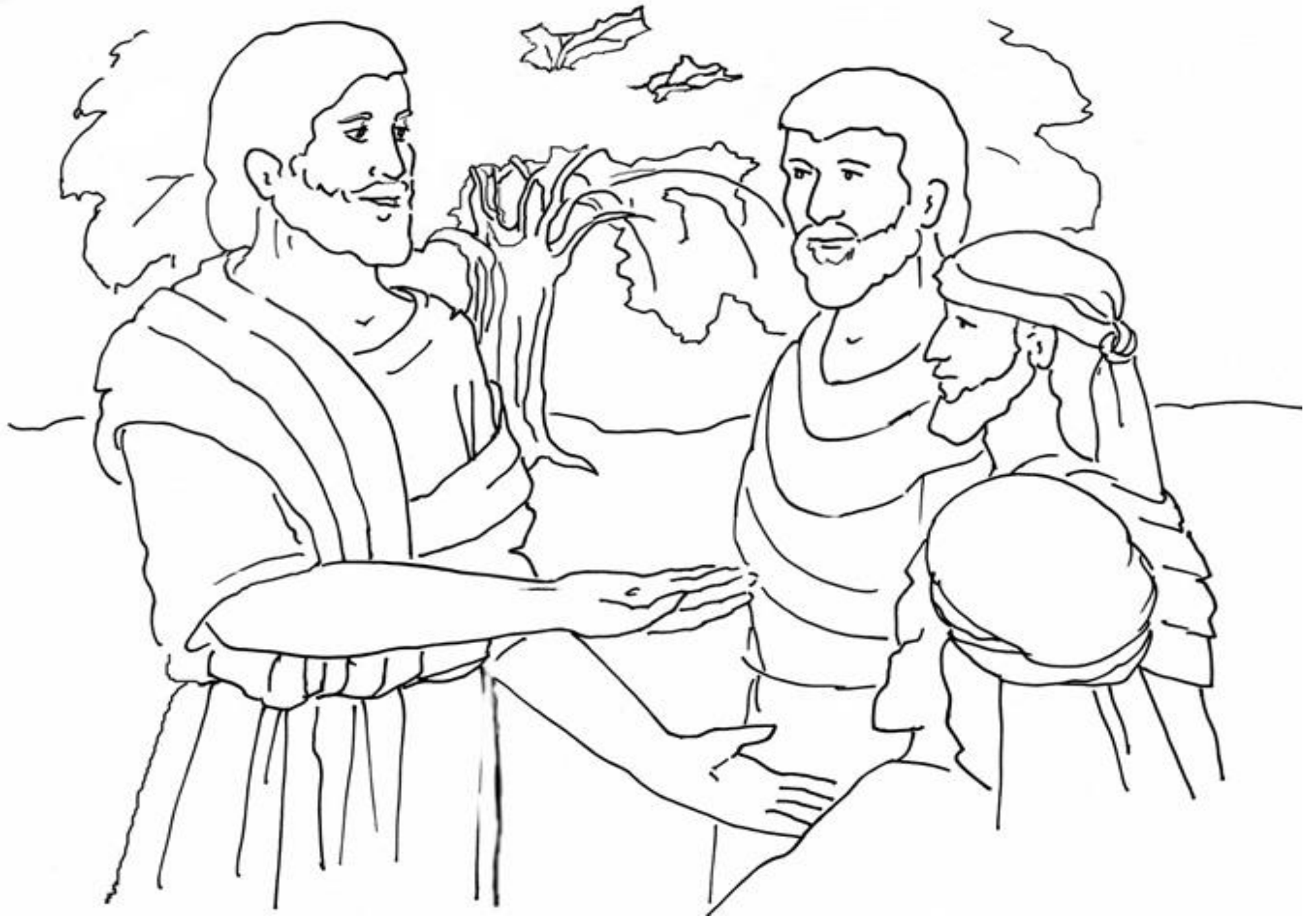
