

MASS RESERVATIONS

The Angelus and Prayers for the Holy Souls will be live-streamed every evening at 6.00 pm during November. Although all services are live-streamed (details on front page) and the Sunday Obligation remains suspended, attendance at some Masses is possible, but only by booking beforehand. If you cannot manage to book online yourself (or ask someone to do it on your behalf), you can phone 07561 646339 on a Monday or a Friday between 11.00 am and 1.00 pm. The volunteer answering the phone will make the online booking on your behalf and be able to confirm if your requested place is available.

NEW TIER 4 RESTRICTIONS

Our numbers at Mass are now limited to 20 persons. It is all the more imperative that you cancel any booking which you are unable to fulfil. This frees the place for someone else up until 10 minutes before Mass. If you cannot get a place, please check back nearer to the Mass since a place may have become available. Please consider the sacrifice of only making one advance booking in these days of increased restriction to allow as many people the opportunity to get to Mass as possible.

OUR ADVENT APPEAL

Next Sunday begins the Season of Advent. Last year we had a very successful appeal providing the bare necessities of life for Refugees and Asylum Seekers. Unfortunately it will not be possible to repeat the Appeal in the same way this year but we would like once again to support refugees and asylum seekers here in Glasgow, just in a different way. *Positive Action in Housing* is a Glasgow refugee and migrant homelessness and human rights charity who are running a Winter Refugee Appeal. In the run up to Christmas they will be safely distributing essential crisis support to 200 asylum seeking families and individuals in Glasgow. This year, instead of collecting bags we invite you donate money to the charity's Winter Appeal 2020, allowing them to provide PPE, food, bus vouchers, winter-wear and hygiene kits. By giving a donation you will be directly supporting those who have fled war and persecution in their own countries, risking their lives on dangerous journeys, to find sanctuary here, leaving loved ones, friends and all that they know. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king *until he has put all his enemies under his feet* and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death, for everything is to be *put under his feet*. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

Matthew 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. 'Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me." 'And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'


First reading

Crossword Puzzle








