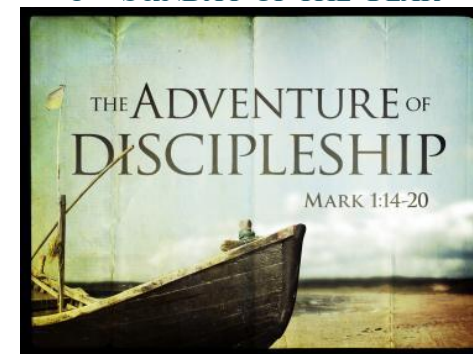

## First reading

Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the Lord was addressed to  
Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh,  
the great city, and preach to them as I  
told you to.' Jonah set out and went to  
Nineveh in obedience to the word of  
the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great  
beyond compare: it took three days to  
cross it. Jonah went on into the city,  
making a day's journey. He preached in

Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And

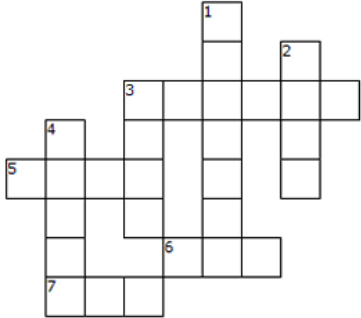

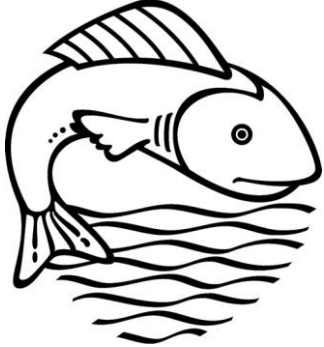

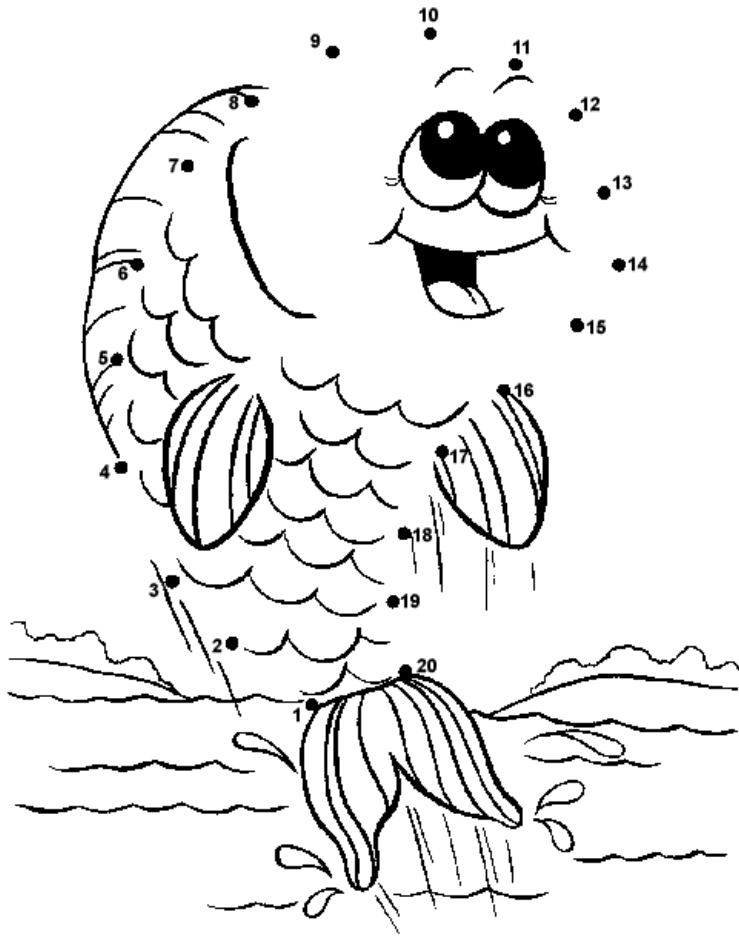

# Dot to Dot Puzzle

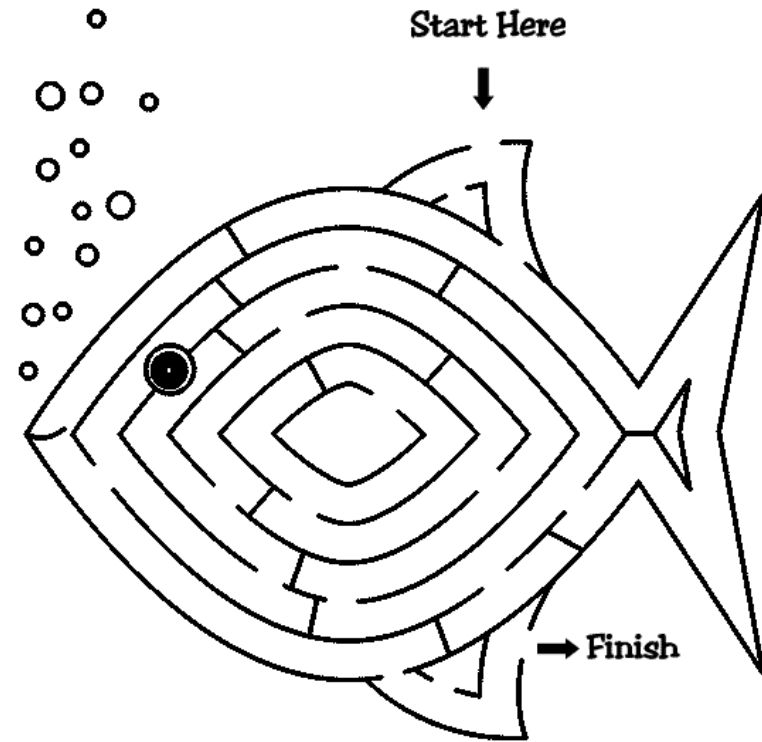

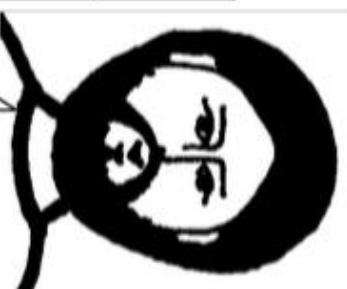
