



WEEKDAY MASSES:

Beginning this week it will no longer be necessary to book a place for attendance at weekday Masses. We will, however, continue to collect contact details as a requirement of the Trace and Protect service.

WEEKEND MASSES:

For now the booking system will remain in place for Sunday Masses. You can make a booking by visiting the **Mass Registration** page on the parish website. If you are unable to do this (or ask someone to do it for you), you can call the booking number **(07561 646339)** on a Monday between 11.00 am and 1.00 pm. On-Line bookings will open at **6.00 pm on Mondays** for the following Sunday.

IN GENERAL:

- **The wearing of Face Masks** continues to be mandatory within the Church.
- You are asked to continue to **Sanitise** your hands on entry and exit.
- Please continue to cooperate with the guidance and directions given by the parish volunteers.
- Due to the increased numbers you can now enter using both main doors. Please follow the direction of the stewards for exit.

- The church will open 20-25 minutes before the beginning of Mass. Please try to give yourself plenty of time.
- For funerals, we will give priority to the family of the deceased. We will let you know in advance if there is likely to be any limitation on space available.

SEATING:

We can now use every second row in the Church and these are marked with yellow stickers to indicate intervals of one metre. **Please move as far into the bench as you can and sit at the first available yellow sticker.** With the increased numbers we are more dependent than ever that you take responsibility for observing the one metre physical distancing.

GOSPEL

John 6:1-15

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee – or of Tiberias – and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick.

Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover. Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.








