For **SUNDAY MASSES**: There are two different options to enable us to fulfill the continuing Government requirement to collect and temporarily retain your contact details:

- The **preferred method** is to use your smart phone camera to scan the QR code above – it is also displayed on posters around the Church. This will allow you to enter your details in the same way as you would for other venues. You will be asked for your name, contact number, and the number of people in your group. So only one person in each family/group needs to do this. Once you have entered this information once it should be retained for future visits
- If you do not have access to a smart phone, our volunteers will offer you a card which you need to complete with the same required information. You should then place the completed card in

one of the white offertory collection boxes which are positioned around the Church. You will need to do this each Sunday you visit Saint Helen's – so maybe you could take a few cards home with you and bring one already completed on the next occasion when you come to Mass.

For **WEEKDAY MASSES**: If you are a regular, just give your name to the volunteer and you will be ticked off the list of regular visitors. If it's your first time back to a weekday Mass you will be asked for your name and contact number on your first visit and then you have become a regular! You will just need to be ticked off on your next visit!

Some final points to bear in mind...

- **Masks/Face Coverings are still to be worn in the Church.**
- **You will still be asked to sanitise your hands on entering and leaving the Church.**
- **We will be maintaining a routine of cleaning surfaces and spaces within the church.**
- **You are welcome to light candles yourself without assistance from the volunteers. Please just make sure your hands are dry after using sanitizer.**
- **Some people may still be a little nervous about indoor gatherings, so please continue to respect personal space – the church is large enough to allow people to spread themselves out so that everyone is comfortable.**

*Luke 1:39-56*

She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.' 


