For Sunday Masses, the preferred method is to check in using the QR code above (which is also displayed prominently on posters throughout the Church). If you do not have access to a smart phone, our volunteers will give you a check-in card which you are asked to complete and place in the white boxes located around the church along with your Mass offering.

For weekday Masses you will be checked off the list if you are a regular attendee – or our volunteers will take a one-off note of your name and details if you have not visited for a while

Some further points to bear in mind...

- **Masks/Face Coverings are still to be worn in the Church.**
- **You will still be asked to sanitise your hands on entering and leaving the Church.**
- **We will be maintaining a routine of cleaning surfaces and spaces within the church.**
- **You are welcome to light candles yourself without assistance from**

the volunteers. Please just make sure your hands are dry after using sanitizer.

- *Some people may still be a little nervous about indoor gatherings, so please continue to respect personal space – the church is large enough to allow people to spread themselves out so that everyone is comfortable.*

Listen, my dear brothers: it was those who are poor according to the world that God chose, to be rich in

faith and to be the heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him.

Mark 7:31-37

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'




