incorporates staffing requirements and assigns leads to coordinate activities and events. As we proceed through the year, specific line items within the plan will be addressed both in the financial aspect as well as staffing support needed to ensure resources are balanced.

Faith In Action

Faith In Action (FIA) is a relatively new program that Supreme adopted to replace the *Surge with Service* program of five decades. FIA consists of four categories: Faith, Family, Community and Life. Tying Council activities with support of our parish is an essential element of FIA. Our Budget/Strategic Plan contains details of the areas of focus in FY2019-2020 for each of these categories and their associated activities. Here is a brief summary of FIA:

Faith Deacon Tom Grant, Lead. Planned activities include a Spiritual Retreat, Masses for departed brothers, Sacramental Gifts, and First Friday Mass and Rosary.

Family Brother Stan Anthony, Lead. Activities include the Knight/Family of the Month/Year, Keep Christ in Christmas, and the Food for Families Program.

Community Brother Dennis O'Leary, Lead. Activities include Habitat for Humanity, Giving Tree, Sugar Bowl, Citizens with Disabilities, Meals on Wheels, Bethesda House, and TBA Donations.

Life TBA, Lead. Activities include Ultrasound, Pregnancy Support, Culture of Life, and Novena for Life.

Additional Council Functions

In addition to the FIA categories listed above our Council undertakes other functions that are reflected in our Strategic Plan.

Parish Support This year our Council is making an increased effort to better support the Parish. Activities such as Pancake Breakfast, Coffee & Donuts after Sunday Mass, and Mother's Day Flowers are familiar ones. New activities will be added as the year progresses.

Membership Larry Kocen as Chancellor leads this effort.

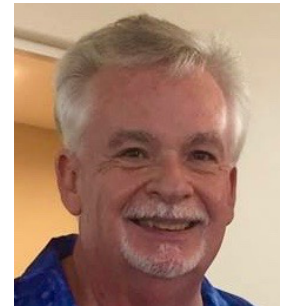
Retention The Deputy Grand Knight will be leading this effort and will be relying on the support of the Chancellor and the Trustees.
