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Summer ELA and Math Maintenance – Grade 5

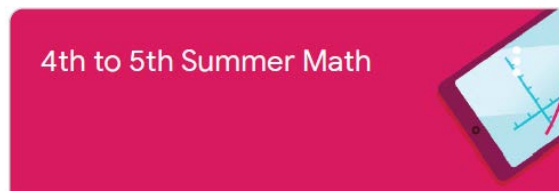
“Life is like riding a bicycle. To keep your balance you must keep moving.” -Albert Einstein
