



UPDATE on REOPENING

After months apart we are pleased to let you know that we will be able to reopen our church in phases following the guidelines of the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health and the approval of Bishop Marc Trudeau. Very Important to note – **ONLY 100 People are allowed inside the church at a time. This includes Mass and personal prayer.** Dispensation for attending Mass has been extended by the Archbishop until further notice. Please be kind to each other and adhere to these guidelines.

Important Dates:

Beginning Wednesday June 3, 2020 Open for daily prayer from 10 am to 2 pm.

Confessions 11:00 am to 1:00 pm.

Please follow instructions from greeter – Limit 100 people at a time inside the church.

Saturday June 6th and Sunday June 7th - Mass resumes - Limit 100 people per Mass

Saturday, June 6th 4:00 pm & 5:30 pm Vigil

Sunday, June 7th - 7:00 am, 8:30am, 10:00 am, 11:30 am, 1:00 pm (Spanish), 5:30 pm

Daily Mass will be at 8am beginning Monday, June 8th.

Out of gratitude and charity, we present these guidelines and ask you to kindly follow them. For some, they may appear too strict and others might find them too relaxed. Yet, we believe these prudent guidelines will allow us to reverently celebrate Mass while also being cautious and respectful. If you have displayed any symptoms of illness in the past two weeks, please refrain from attending. Dispensation for attending Mass continues indefinitely.

- Per state guidelines, we ask that you come wearing a face mask (adults and children over the age of 3)
- Seating will be assigned. Many rows will be blocked off, and an usher will be there to direct you to your seat. You will be able to sit with your family, but spread at least 6 feet from others
- Stand 6 feet apart in line to receive communion. *Leave your mask on to receive the Eucharist in your enthroned hands, step to the side to place in your mouth and return your mask over your mouth.*
- Communion will be distributed in the hand only.
- No Precious Blood will be distributed.
- The priests and Eucharistic ministers will use hand sanitizer before distributing communion.
- Please refrain from unnecessarily touching surfaces in the Church.
- Adoration Chapel will stay closed for now.
- Please arrive 10-15 minutes before Mass.
- Enter and exit through designated doors.
- An Usher will greet you at the door, provide a worship aid, and show you where to sit.
- No holy water will be available.
- Sign of Peace to be exchanged without physical contact.
- No missalettes/music issues.
- For airflow, doors to the church will remain open.
- We ask you to respectfully dismiss after Mass so that we continue to observe Social Distancing.
- Social gatherings after Mass are not appropriate at this time (no coffee and donuts).

The Richness Of The Spirit

Students, and most adults recalling their school days, are familiar with the phrase “compare and contrast” that shows up from time to time on tests. Today we hear two different accounts of the giving of the Holy Spirit to the church. Let’s contrast, then compare. Luke’s account from Acts is filled with arresting details: the mighty wind from heaven, the tongues of flame, the miracle of different languages. John’s account seems timid: fearful disciples, the wounded Christ, the expelling of breath from his risen body, not from the sky. Our literal, modern minds wonder which way it happened; our noisy culture probably makes us prefer the former. But if we compare the two, we find that the dazzling richness of the Spirit fills both accounts, for it is the very breath of the risen Christ, ascended to the sky in Luke, that appears to his disciples in John and sends his followers forth to carry on his mission of forgiving sin and proclaiming the mighty acts of God.

Did You Know?

Teach children how to explain inappropriate behavior

Statistics show that children may tell their story of abuse to adults as many as nine times before someone recognizes what is being disclosed and takes action.

An important part of empowering children to protect themselves from abuse is giving them the right language to explain inappropriate or uncomfortable behaviors they may encounter. A child who can describe what happened to make him feel violated or uneasy can much more easily communicate with trusted adults to stop a predator, or end a potentially dangerous situation. Un niño que puede describir lo que le hizo sentir violado/a o incómodo/a será capaz de comunicarse con adultos en quienes confía para detener al depredador, o para poner fin a una situación potencialmente peligrosa. Scripture Focus:

Christians use the language of the Trinity so often that we don't notice it anymore. Our baptismal promises, wedding vows, Creeds, and prayers all bear the stamp of the three persons of the Holy Trinity. Is it possible to give this basic aspect of our Christian life its due in one special feast day? The readings in today's liturgy remind us how deeply and permanently God has entered our lives and tell us something of who God is. To Moses, God is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness. To the psalmist, God is worthy of glory and praise for all time. To Paul, God is love and peace, the grace given through Jesus Christ and the unifying power of the Holy Spirit. The extent of God's care for us is found in Jesus Christ. Through him, we have become adopted children of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus and of one another in Him.

Reflection:

1. Can you identify with Moses', the psalmist's or Paul's experience of God? Describe who God is for you today.
2. Remember a time when you felt God's care for you in Jesus Christ. Who helped you to know that God cared?
3. Think of all the times you say "Father, Son and Holy Spirit" in your prayer. Name some of those times and try to pray with special attention to the Holy Trinity this week.


