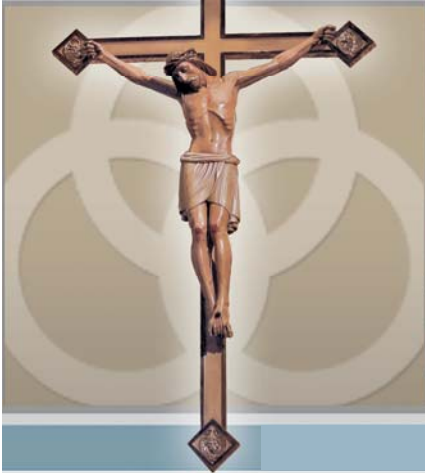

Today's Reflection: Why Pray?

The "foreigners" as Isaiah calls them, the "Gentiles" as Paul calls them, or the "Canaanites" as Matthew calls them are called to worship the one true God in prayer. As we listen to today's readings, perhaps we are tempted to ask: Why pray? The question is rhetorical; it is tantamount to asking why should friends talk to one another or people in love kiss one another. Prayer is a way of relating to God, a way of talking to God. The apostles had the opportunity to talk to Jesus in the flesh. We have the opportunity to talk to Jesus Christ in prayer. Our relationship with him must be enthusiastic; it cannot be faint-hearted. John Donne, a fifteenth-century poet, knew what the qualities of good prayer were. Donne asks God to treat him differently from most Christians. The poet does not want God to merely "knock, breathe, shine, and seek to mend," but also to "break, blow, burn, and make me new" (*Holy Sonnets*, XIV).

It takes a dynamic faith on our part to come to God in prayer. As Jesus once said, "Knock and the door will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). It may take pounding the door down, but if we are as persistent as the woman in today's Gospel, the results will follow.

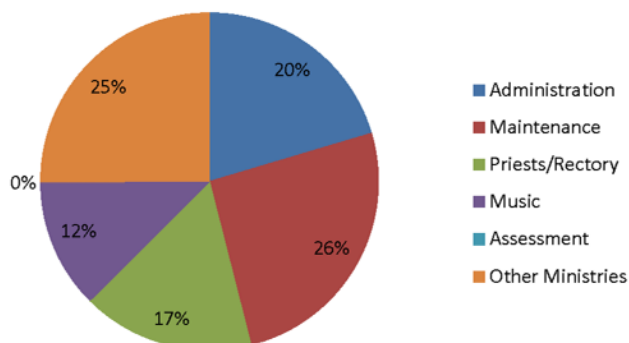

Church Doors Now Closed

Per the Archbishop, in consultation with the Auxiliary Bishops and the Council of Priests, the church doors are closed to the public until further notice. Please continue to pray and stay well.

Dispensation Until Further Notice

Given the continuing limitation on large public gatherings, and so as to allow people who are not well or otherwise at risk the ability to stay home, the following provisions will remain in effect until further notice:

- **The general dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass remains in place until further notice.**
- People in vulnerable populations are encouraged to stay home.
- Parishioners are reminded of the need for smaller congregations (**100 people maximum per Mass**).
- Live-streaming of weekday Masses remains available at lacatholics.org or on You Tube (**Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels**)
- No social sharing of food or drink before or after Mass or any other gathering.

Although we encourage you to watch daily Mass and Sunday Mass (if you can), we know how important it is for you to receive communion. So each Sunday an



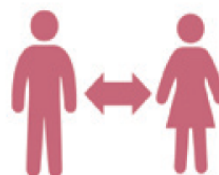

Liturgy Matters Donna Barnes

As the Director of Music for Holy Trinity I want you to be aware of the most recent guidelines we have received from the Archdiocese and how our music ministry is implementing them. Even with our Masses being outdoors these guidelines are extremely important.

MUSIC AND SINGING IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF LOS ANGELES DURING THE CORONAVIRUS PANDEMIC

On Saturday, July 4, the LA County Department of Public Health (LADPH) published online its guidelines for Houses of Worship, specifically information regarding singing and chanting. In conversations with personnel from the LACDPH, it was clear that the guidelines were intended to refer to congregational singing and chanting.

In light of these guidelines, parishes are to observe the following guidelines regarding music and singing:

- Choirs are not allowed. Unfortunately, our 8:30 & 10:00 a.m. & 1:00 p.m. choirs cannot return at this time.
- Parishes can utilize a soloist who must always practice enhanced social distancing and is monitoring for symptoms. The soloist must be as far away as possible from any other person, at least 12 feet of distance. **I have asked our cantors to act as soloists now; they will remain inside the church.**
- Parishes can also choose to use instruments only. Instrumentalists must maintain physical distancing and use facemasks. Wind and brass instruments should be avoided and are discouraged from use.
- Congregations are not encouraged to sing, but rather should be encouraged to pray silently with the music. **This is so difficult because our goal has always been to sing together as a community. Please do not sing along with the soloist.**

Thank you also for your flexibility in how we must now express our worship in an ever-changing situation. Let us continue to pray for the health and well-being of all people.

Scripture Focus:

Matthew is the only evangelist to use the term “Church.” Church is an earthly experience of the Kingdom of God. Because Jesus is always with us, the Church can never fail. The keys symbolize opening up the doors to truth and wisdom. Giving the “keys of the kingdom” means that authority is being given to teach and make decisions for the Church community, although the extent of that authority is not clear. Authority exists only for the sake of the Church community and its work of proclaiming the Kingdom.

Reflection:

1. When have you felt overwhelmed by responsibility? What did you do about it?
2. When has being part of the Church helped you see life more clearly and act with courage? When has the Church been an obstacle?
3. Relate an experience when you were a “rock of strength” for another person.
4. In your experience, what is it like to be entrusted with a set of keys (to a car, a house, an office or a store)?

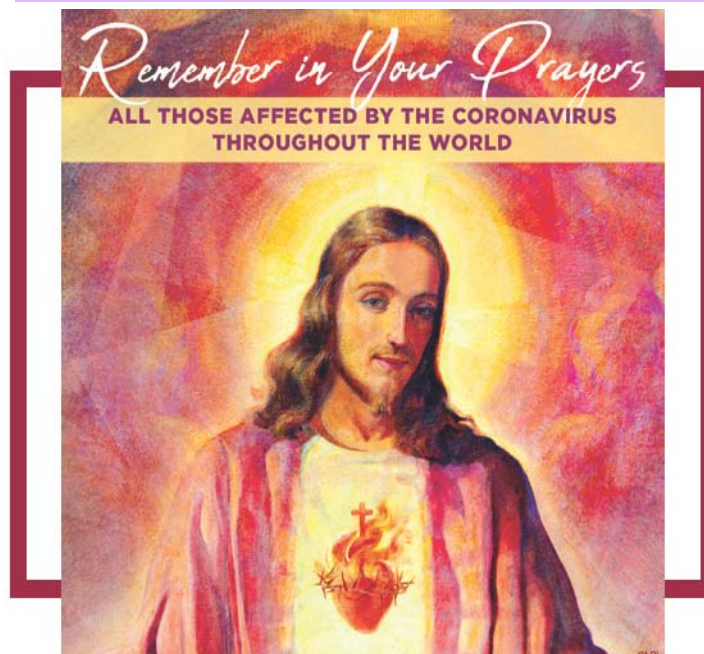
