





(2) The pandemic affected the budget in several areas:

- a. Fundraising: the major HTPA sponsored golf tournament
- b. Scrip Income
- c. Due to the closure of the physical school building, our auxiliary program incomes impacted: Day Care, Summer School, Lunch Program, and Student Activities.

(3) In comparing expenses between 2018-2019 and 2019-2020, there are two major differences. Educational expenses were much less in 2019-2020 for three reasons.

- a. Our expenses for the auxiliary programs were less due to no students on campus, thus we did not have the income or the expenses that go with the Lunch Program, Fundraising, Athletics, and Student Activities.
- b. We made a major purchase in 2018-2019 of a new reading program which included a five-year license where we receive new reading workbooks each year for five years.
- c. The school hired our own Spanish teacher in 2019-2020, saving the outsourced cost from the previous year.

Capital Expenses were higher in 2019-2020:

Projects completed include the shade structure and lunch benches in the lot behind the church, the canopy on the main school yard, the paving of both parking lots/playgrounds on Walker Street, and the blue Sports Court on the one yard. These upgrades to our physical plant will serve us well for many years to come.

(4) The school applied for and received a Payroll Protection Program Loan of \$447,298. This allowed us to continue to pay employees through the end of the school year, summer salaries and utilities. A balance of \$240,435 remained at the end of June. This amount is not included in the bank balances. These funds were used over the summer and for the first payroll of the new school year.

Dear Holy Trinity Parishioners,

Holy Trinity School presents its 2019-2020 Financial Report to you today. On March 13, 2020, the school building closed to in-person instruction, and learning began on March 17 with Distance Learning. Our families continued to faithfully pay their tuition, as they could. Many needed assistance as their hours were cut, they were furloughed, or they had to make the choice to stay home to care for the children no longer in school. It has been a difficult time for all.

Our two greatest financial “hits” were in the area of fundraising and the auxiliary programs which typically bring in a large portion of our income.

We thank our God for the gift of the Payroll Protection Program Loan which allowed us to continue to pay our teachers and staff so we could continue to educate our children.

We continue to take very seriously our stewardship of the funds we receive, both for tuition from our families and donations given by our supporters. As always, we are grateful to all of our parishioners who support the school in the many ways: green envelopes, the Gala, Ave Maria, Better Half Club, tuition assistance, and donations! We could not do what we do without you.

Church Doors Are Closed

Per the Archbishop in consultation with the Auxiliary Bishops and the Council of Priests, the church doors are closed to the public until further notice. Please continue to pray and stay well.

Dispensation Until Further Notice

Given the continuing limitation on large public gatherings, and so as to allow people who are not well or otherwise at risk the ability to stay home, the following provisions will remain in effect until further notice:

- **The general dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass remains in place until further notice.**
- People in vulnerable populations are encouraged to stay home.
- Parishioners are reminded of the need for smaller congregations (**100 people maximum per Mass**).
- Live-streaming of weekday Masses remains available at lacatholics.org or on You Tube (**Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels**)
- No social sharing of food or drink before or after Mass or any other gathering.

Drive Up Communion Available

Although we encourage you to watch daily Mass and Sunday Mass (if you can), we know how important it is for you to receive communion. So each Sunday an Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister will be available to distribute communion to those who wish to safely receive the Eucharist in their automobiles. You may stay in your vehicle and drive through the parking lot on the corner of Sepulveda & Walker Street anytime between 4-5 p.m. to safely receive communion.



Please allow yourself a few extra minutes before and after to sanitize your hands, and to put yourself in a prayerful place.

The Blessed Eucharist is exposed on the outdoor Altar for public adoration Monday thru Saturday from **8:30 a.m. until 1:00 p.m.** (unless there is a funeral).

IDENTIFICATION:

On Tuesday, November 3, you do not need to bring an ID. (ID rules may vary for absentee ballots and first-time voters.)

VOTE-BY-MAIL/ABSENTEE:

Your ballot REQUEST must be RECEIVED by Tuesday, October 27, 2020.

Your completed ballot must be POSTMARKED no later than Tuesday, November 3 and RECEIVED no later than Friday, November 20.

Scripture Focus

The Sermon on the Mount begins with eight Beatitudes. The words of the Beatitudes have sustained believers from age to age.

The Beatitudes bespeak reversal. They describe a dire situation in the present which somehow will be vindicated and reversed in the future at the coming of God's kingdom. These statements of Jesus provide no practical advice for successful living. Instead they offer prophetic declarations oriented to the future reality of the fullness of God's kingdom.

The Beatitudes are addressed to the whole faith community and not just individuals. They emphasize the need and value of meekness, being merciful, having a pure heart, and working for peace.

In a very real way, saints are beatitude people. Their lives are not characterized by perfection but by hope and faithfulness. They know how things are in the here and now, but they also are convinced that things will be different in the future.

Reflection

1. How do you apply the beatitudes to your everyday life, by your interaction with family, friends or those you meet on the street or at work?
2. Recall a time when you experienced the beatitudes in your own life.
3. Which beatitude speaks to you? Which one helps you to sustain your faith?
4. Sit for a moment in quiet and allow the Beatitudes to speak to your heart. Place yourself sitting on the Mount and listening to Jesus speak these words to all gathered. What did you experience in that moment?
