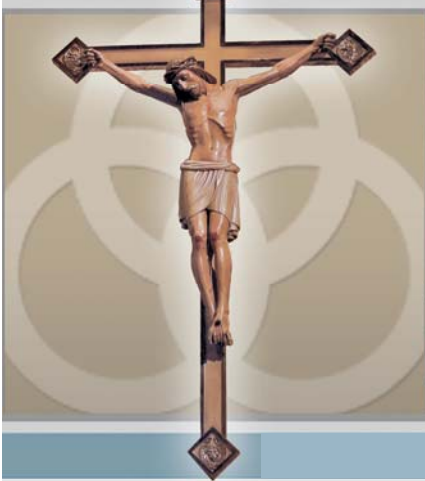

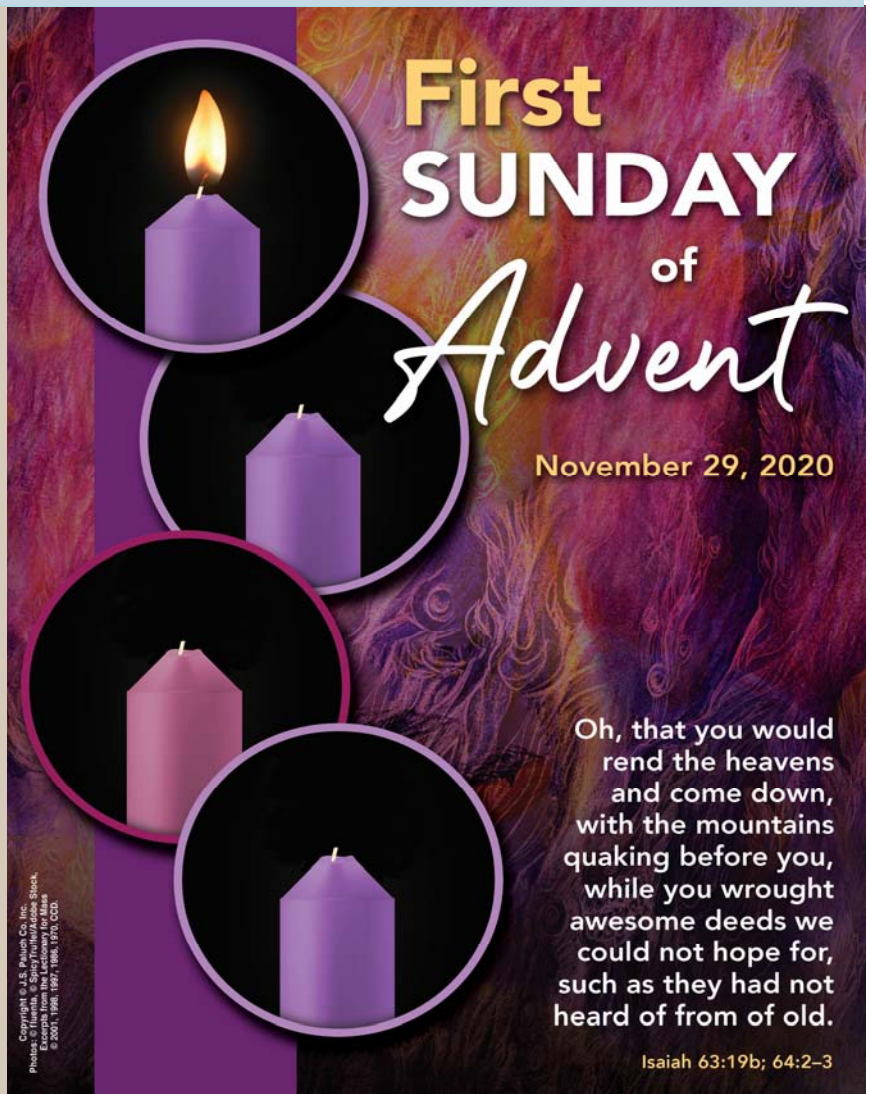

## Today's Readings

**First Reading** — We are the clay and you, O Lord, are the potter: we are the work of your hands (Isaiah 63:16b-17, 19b; 64:2-7).

**Psalm** — Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved (Psalm 80).

**Second Reading** — God is faithful; by God you were called to fellowship with the Son (1 Corinthians 1:3-9).

**Gospel** — Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. (Mark 13:33-37).

## Today's Reflection: Mark's Jesus

Mark's Gospel is the shortest and tersest of all four. The discourses of Jesus tend to be terser as well. Mark's portrayal of Jesus has none of the poetry of the Sermon on the Mount or the Sermon on the Plain as in Matthew or Luke, nor the extensive, reflective "I Am" discourses as in John. Mark's Jesus "cuts to the chase," we would say today. This is reflected quite well in today's passage.

It is no accident that the dialogue of Jesus at this point in the Gospel according to Mark—the concluding words about the end of the world—immediately before his passion, is riddled with exclamation points and an overall sense of urgency.

We would do well to re-tool our own way of living this Advent, for we live in a world urgently in need of hearing the message of Jesus proclaimed. It's time for us to "wake up!" and get out into the world to do it.

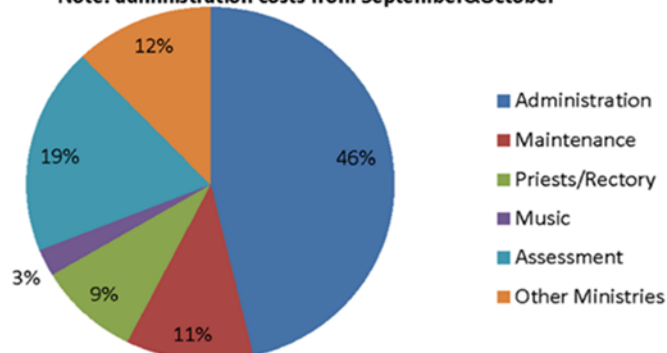

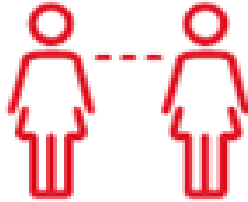

### Church Doors Are Closed

Per the Archbishop in consultation with the Auxiliary Bishops and the Council of Priests, the church doors are closed to the public until further notice. Please continue to pray and stay well.

### Dispensation Until Further Notice

Given the continuing limitation on large public gatherings, and so as to allow people who are not well or otherwise at risk the ability to stay home, the following provisions will remain in effect until further notice:

- **The general dispensation from the Sunday obligation to attend Mass remains in place until further notice.**
- People in vulnerable populations are encouraged to stay home.
- Parishioners are reminded of the need for smaller congregations (**100 people maximum per Mass**).
- Live-streaming of weekday Masses remains available at [lacatholics.org](http://lacatholics.org) or on You Tube (**Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels**)
- No social sharing of food or drink before or after Mass or any other gathering.

### Drive Up Communion Available

Although we encourage you to watch daily Mass and Sunday Mass (if you can), we know how important it is for you to receive communion.



So each Sunday an Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister will be available to distribute communion to those who wish to safely receive the Eucharist in their automobiles. You may stay in your vehicle and drive through the parking lot on the corner of Sepulveda & Walker Street anytime between 4-5 p.m. to safely receive communion.

Please allow yourself a few extra minutes before and after to sanitize your hands, and to put yourself in a prayerful place.

### Eucharistic Adoration Outside

The Blessed Eucharist is exposed on the outdoor Altar for public adoration Monday thru Saturday from **8:30 a.m. until 1:00 p.m.** (unless there is a funeral). Please adhere to the guidelines found at top of page four.

## Outside Confessions

Confessions are offered just outside of the main entrance doors of the church **Wednesday thru Saturday from 11:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m.** or by appointment (310-548-6535, ext. 300). Please continue to adhere to the COVID-19 guidelines as listed at the top of page four.

## Mass Intentions for 2021

The parish office (209 N. Hanford Ave.) is now taking Mass intentions for the 2021 calendar year, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Masses can be offered for a loved one or friend, living or deceased, or for a special occasion. Three Masses per family may be requested per month and the minimum offering is \$15 per Mass, cash or check only please. A card for you to mail can be provided upon request.



## Tax-Wise Giving Options

### Gifts from an IRA

If you are 70 ½ or older, you can make a tax-free gift directly from your IRA account to Holy Trinity Church. This law allows you to transfer any amount up to \$100,000 annually directly to a qualified charitable organization without paying income tax on the distribution. The transfer does not generate taxable income or a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your tax deductions. Your gift can satisfy all or part of your required minimum distribution.

### Gifts of Stock

Gifts of appreciated assets such as stock are an excellent way for you to make a charitable gift. Stocks may be transferred directly to the Archdiocese for the benefit of Holy Trinity Parish, school or favorite Catholic ministry. These gifts will not affect your cash flow, and they provide the following tax benefits:

- A possible charitable deduction to help you save on taxes
- Bypass of federal and state capital gains taxes
- Avoidance of the tax on net investment income

From a tax perspective, a gift of appreciated assets makes good sense. You can make the capital gains taxes optional, achieve significant tax savings and support our programs.

### Did You Know?

#### The devastating effects of verbal abuse

A study by Florida State University found that children who were verbally abused are more likely to experience depression and anxiety. They are also twice as likely to suffer with mood and anxiety disorders throughout their lifetime. Children who suffer such abuse can go on to repeat the same parenting styles they experienced thereby continuing the cycle of abuse. Pay attention to the language you and others use with your children. Breaking the chain of negative behaviors starts with positive, healthy parent-child relationships. #### Scripture Focus:

Today, we begin with chapter one of Mark, the Gospel that will be read throughout this year. The opening verse tells us that Jesus himself is the Gospel, the Good News. This good news, which concerns Jesus Christ, begins with the prophet John (the forerunner of the Messiah) urging the people to a complete change of heart, a repentance in order to “prepare a way for the Lord” in their lives. The Good News is that it was God who first loved us. It takes humility to recognize our need of God and to accept His help. The call of John to repentance asks each of us “What in my life needs a complete turning around if I am to recognize the Lord when he comes?”

#### Reflection:

1. Relate an experience when someone helped you to see your need to change.
2. Describe a time you helped make someone’s pathway easier.
3. Describe an experience when you prepared for a special someone coming into your home. Who would you have a hard time welcoming into your home?

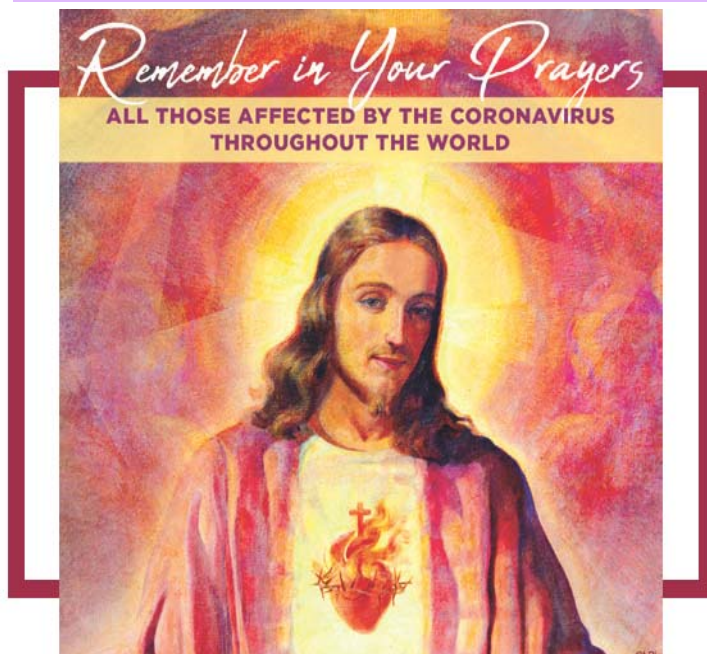
