



Today's Reflection: The Wind and The Sea

Living along the shores of Lake Superior—the “big lake,” as the locals call it—you can often hear the advice, “Respect the lake; don’t take it for granted.” People who know Lake Superior respect its power and watch out for its many moods. Sunken ships and boats crushed into kindling are testimonies to what the lake can do.

The readings of this Sunday evoke our memories of the lake, of the mighty Mississippi River, or of the ocean itself. Who but God can control these mighty waters and set limits to their advance? The lake described in today’s Gospel was a body of water subject to sudden storms and churned into dangerous waves by terrible winds.

But these mighty agents are subject to God. The sailor and the fisher all respect the water. Even more, they respect the awesome power of the Maker of wind and sea.



Letter from Most Reverend Jose H Gomez June 12, 2021

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The coronavirus pandemic has affected our world and society in ways we could never have imagined.

Early on in the pandemic, many people experienced great fears and anxieties in the face of tremendous uncertainty. We recognized the fragility of our human nature. However, it also brought us closer together as one family seeking the good and wellbeing of the other. Most importantly, through this pandemic, we came to recognize our deep reliance on God and the truth of God's abiding love for us, His sons and daughters.

We remain strong in our faith knowing that God will always be by our side.

Thankfully, we continue to make significant progress in our fight against the pandemic in the three counties of the Archdiocese. We can look forward to better days in which we can actively live our faith as the Body of Christ in our parish communities.

And so, on June 19th and 20th, I encourage the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles to return to in-person Sunday Mass and the celebration of the Sacraments, especially for those who are in good health.

By this letter, effective June 19, 2021, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in response to the coronavirus pandemic will be lifted for the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.

Those who have serious and legitimate reasons (e.g., illness, underlying health conditions that renders them susceptible to illness, significant fears of becoming ill, etc.) are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.

In these cases, Pastors are to encourage the faithful to keep the Lord's Day holy by reading the Gospels, praying with their families, or joining themselves to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an Act of Spiritual Communion.

Know that I am praying for you, and I ask you to please pray for me and my ministry.

May Jesus bless us with good health, peace, and joy.

Eucharistic Adoration continues to flourish at Holy Trinity. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the main altar of the church Monday through Saturday immediately after the 8 AM Mass and reposed at 1 PM.

If another event is scheduled in the church during those hours, Eucharistic Adoration will be held in the Children's Chapel that day. Signs will be posted in both entrances to notify the general public. Please adhere to the safety guidelines that are listed below.

Adoration is a quiet time spent in prayer before Jesus who is present in the Blessed Sacrament. As a form of respect, you should always genuflect when you see the Lord in the Host. Maintain an attitude of respect and silence if others are present. Keep in mind that you are in the presence of Christ.



Using the “What If” game to raise problem-solving children

The “What If” game is a great way to walk your children through potential scenarios, and work with them to find the best solutions. Ask your children about “what if” scenarios, mixing silly questions with real world ones to keep them engaged and thinking, like “What if you had super powers?” and “What if a stranger asked you to go somewhere with him at the mall?” You can empower your children with problem-solving skills that will keep them safe even when you can’t be there to protect them. Scripture Focus:

In a culture that likes to deny death or keep it at a distance, the readings today confront death and reveal God’s plan for life—full abundant life even after death. The gospel shows two desperate people. A father begs Jesus to help his sick daughter. An afflicted woman reaches out to Jesus for a cure. Both people put aside fears in their frantic search for help. By seeking Jesus, Jairus risks the ridicule of his fellow synagogue officials. The unclean woman risks the crowd’s anger, and possibly Jesus’ anger as well, for her touch. Jesus responds to both tenderly. He calms their fears, confirms their faith and restores the woman to health and Jairus’ daughter to new life. Jesus overpowers sickness and death. He answers people’s spoken and unspoken needs. “God formed [humans] to be imperishable,” says the author of Wisdom. Each of us must trust God’s plan.

Reflection:

1. Relate an experience of “death” in your life. How did your faith help you to cope?
2. Jairus brought Jesus to his dying daughter. To whom do you need to bring Jesus’ healing touch this week? How will you do it?
3. Where in your own life, right now, do you need to hear Jesus’ words, “Do not be afraid; just have faith”?
4. What difficulties do you find in expressing and living your faith in today’s world?
