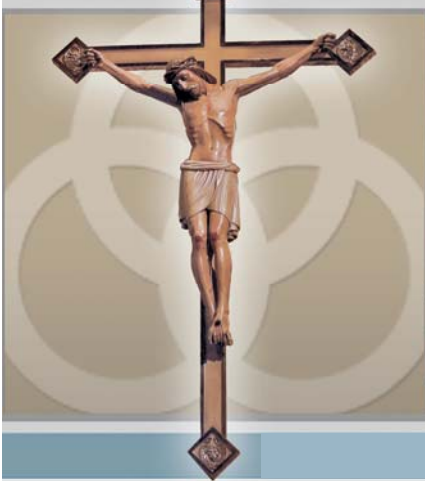

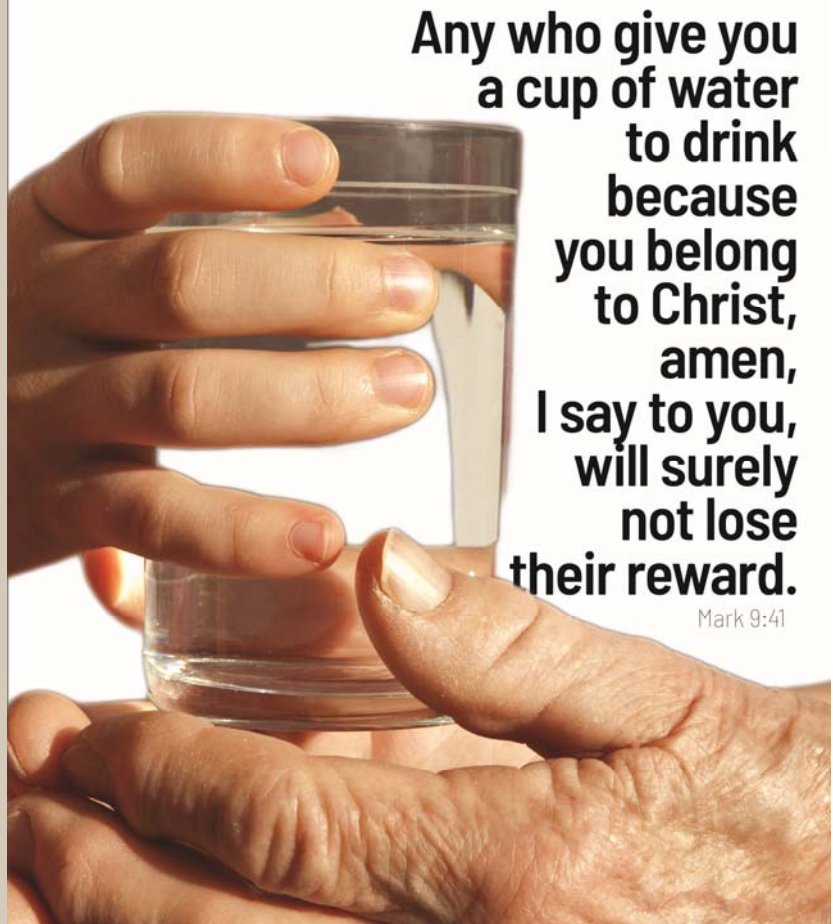

Moses, so close to God's mind in the matter, wishes everyone could possess the spirit of God and proclaim it to the nations.

Psalm 19 celebrates the perfection of God's law, and how it brings joy and delight. It is better than the finest gold or the sweetest honey. Moreover, God gives the wisdom of the prophets to everyone, especially the simple and lowly ones, even to children. It is the "little ones" who proclaim the wonder of God to all.

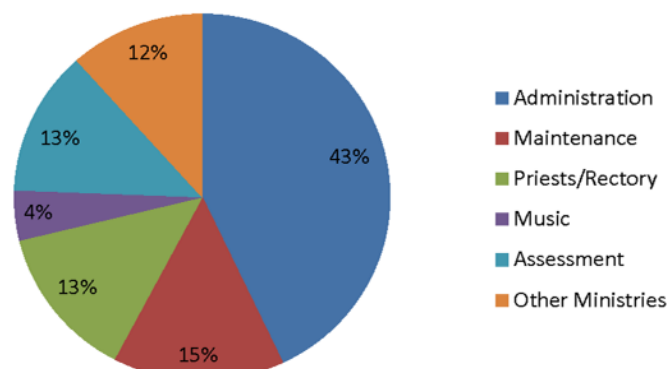

ADLA Position on Religious Exemption to COVID-19 Vaccination

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles, in accordance with the Vatican and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), recommends that all members of the Catholic community, who are able to receive a COVID-19 vaccine, should do so.

“Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.” - USCCB, Moral Considerations Regarding the New COVID-19 Vaccines

Since the vaccinations for COVID-19 have been found morally acceptable to protect the lives and ensure the health of all in our communities, the Archdiocese will not provide religious exemptions to receiving a vaccine against COVID-19.

Dispensation Now Lifted (Effective June 19, 2021)

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in response to the coronavirus pandemic **HAS NOW BEEN LIFTED** for the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.



Those who have serious and legitimate reasons (e.g., illness, underlying health conditions that renders them susceptible to illness, significant fears of becoming ill, etc.) are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.

In these cases, Pastors are to encourage the faithful to keep the Lord's Day holy by reading the Gospels, praying with their families, or joining themselves to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an Act of Spiritual Communion (found on page nine of this bulletin).

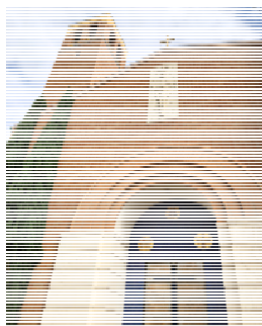

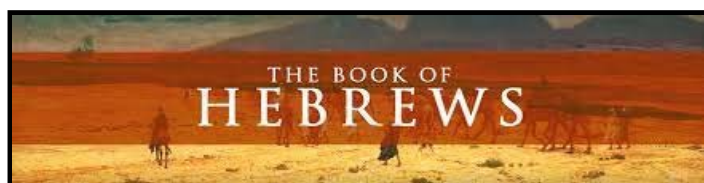

Scripture Focus:

In Mark's Gospel Jesus goes beyond the Law of Moses and back to God's own command. Jesus teaches the clear ideal of Genesis 2. The Hebrews saw a human person as body, soul and spirit, all together. You are your body. So, when a man and woman "become one body," they are like one person. There is no domination of man over woman here. Man and woman complement one another, complete each other.

Reflection:

1. Describe an experience in your life when, because of your trust in a person, you accepted something difficult to understand.
2. How have you lived through the experience of not being accepted by an individual or group?
3. Relate an experience in your marriage or in a close relationship when you felt alone or felt a strong sense of belonging.
4. How have you helped heal the hurt of someone who has divorced?
