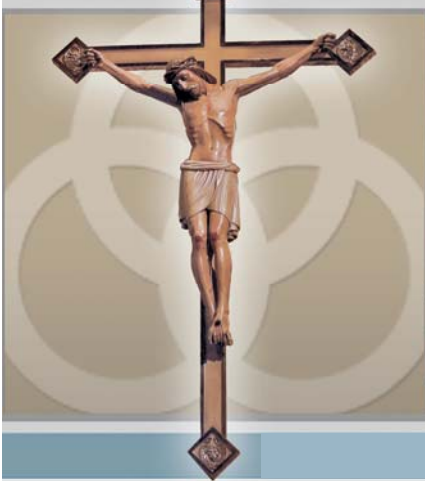

Today's Reflection: The Barriers That Separate Us

We live in a society that has many technological avenues for stimulation and entertainment, one in which the urban population exceeds the non-urban. It is curious that loneliness is a prevalent malady. It is easy to reach out and touch someone, we are told. But—in truth—it is not all that easy, and statistics from the mental health field will reinforce that opinion. Today's readings are about the ways in which we can authentically reach out: God touches Adam to create a mate and end his solitude; God-in-Jesus takes on human flesh and death in order that we might come to glory; Jesus reaches out to the children whom the disciples had tried to keep away, showing us the manner in which we must approach the loving embrace that awaits us in heaven. Until that day, however, we must remember that ours is a sacramental church, a church of signs of the love of God. And so we are called to reach out continually to ease the loneliness and the barriers that separate us from one another and, therefore, from the love of Christ.

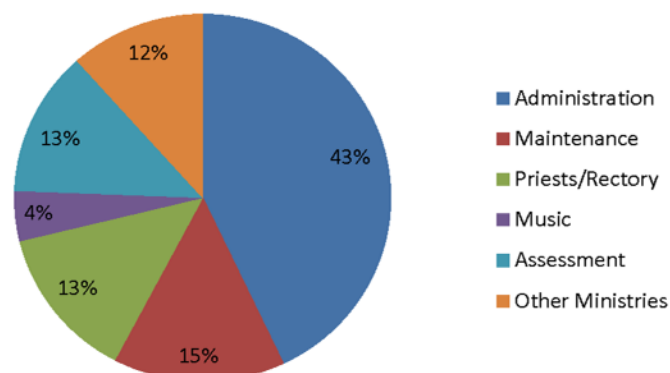

ADLA Position on Religious Exemption to COVID-19 Vaccination

The Archdiocese of Los Angeles, in accordance with the Vatican and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), recommends that all members of the Catholic community, who are able to receive a COVID-19 vaccine, should do so.

“Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good.” - USCCB, Moral Considerations Regarding the New COVID-19 Vaccines

Since the vaccinations for COVID-19 have been found morally acceptable to protect the lives and ensure the health of all in our communities, the Archdiocese will not provide religious exemptions to receiving a vaccine against COVID-19.

Dispensation Now Lifted (Effective June 19, 2021)

The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation in response to the coronavirus pandemic **HAS NOW BEEN LIFTED** for the Catholic faithful of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles.



Those who have serious and legitimate reasons (e.g., illness, underlying health conditions that renders them susceptible to illness, significant fears of becoming ill, etc.) are dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.

In these cases, Pastors are to encourage the faithful to keep the Lord's Day holy by reading the Gospels, praying with their families, or joining themselves to the sacrifice of the Mass by making an Act of Spiritual Communion (found on page nine of this bulletin).

Did You Know?

Talking about stranger danger

The idea of “stranger danger” is often too broad a concept for children to grasp as not all strangers are dangerous, and children will always be meeting new people and on occasion may need to ask a stranger for help. Instead of issuing a blanket warning, try these tips for keeping children safe around people they do not know. If an unknown adult approaches them, have them check with a parent or known and trusted adult before engaging in conversation. This can be as simple as a quick look to the parent followed by a nod indicating that it is okay to interact. As an adult yourself, you can set a good example by talking first to parents, then to children in their care. This helps your own children see how trustworthy adults engage with children around their parents and helps them learn caution for adults who do not act in the same way. ¿Sabe Usted?

Hablar del peligro de los extraños

La idea de “peligro de un extraño” es a menudo un concepto demasiado amplio para que los niños la comprendan, ya que no todos los extraños son peligrosos y los niños siempre conocerán gente nueva y, en ocasiones, es posible que necesiten pedir ayuda a un extraño. En lugar de emitir una advertencia general, pruebe estos consejos para mantener seguros a los niños cuando están cerca de personas que no conocen. Si un adulto desconocido se les acerca, pídale que le pregunten a uno de sus padres o a un adulto conocido y de confianza si puede entablar una conversación con esa persona. Esto puede ser tan simple como una mirada rápida a los padres seguida de un asentimiento que indica que está bien interactuar. Usted mismo, como adulto, puede dar un buen ejemplo hablando primero con los padres de familia y luego con los niños bajo su cuidado. Esto ayuda a sus propios hijos a ver cómo los adultos confiables se relacionan con los niños alrededor de sus padres y les ayuda a aprender a ser cautelosos con los adultos que no actúan de la misma manera. Scripture Focus:

Today’s Gospel illustrates the frequent conflict between wisdom and wealth. The man who asked the secret of everlasting life clearly thought he was a good person. But Jesus senses in this man an attitude of not needing anyone else. Jesus tells him, in effect, “All the resources on which you rely are useless. Get rid of them, trust in God, and follow Me.” The challenge here was not to *poverty* as such, but to trust. Salvation is God’s gift, not a reward for human efforts.

Reflection:

1. Relate an experience when you had to rely on someone other than yourself. How did this make you feel?
2. When have you abandoned something or someone you valued in order to better follow the gospel?
3. When have you worked too hard to earn respect or love?
4. What would you let go of right now to increase your trust in God?
